- 1st Dominion Day - Public Holiday
- 2nd The City Hall was closed from 10:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. in respect to the late City Treasurer and Collector Mr. Geo. S. Shepherd, whose funeral was held at 11:00 a.m.
- 3rd Received letter from Mrs. G. H. Mann, advising having been injured when the Ferry hit the dock at North Vancouver at 6:00 p.m. on Friday June 20th. Referred to the Insurance Co.
- A delegation consisting of Messrs. Beattie and Marshall from the North Vancouver Civic Employees Association approached the Commissioner at 11:30 a.m. with a request for consideration of increases in salary for ferry Ticket sellers & collectors.
- The Commissioner ruled that he could not make any increases over the present scale for this class of work.
- Police Report for the month of May was received and filed.
- "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1941, No. 9" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in-Council.
- Received report from Mate Young that a Mr. Gillies driving a car on No. 4. Ferry having driven too far, was asked to back up and ground fenders with another car. Authorized that copy of report be forwarded to the Insurance Co.
- Authorized that application for Grant for A.R.P. work be sent to the Attorney-General at Victoria.
- 4th Received invitation from the Vancouver Exhibition Association to attend the "all out for Victory" Parade on August 25th. Authorized that the Vancouver Exhibition Association be advised that the Commissioner cannot spend money on a float but that he will attend the Parade in a decorated car.
- Authorized that application be made to the B.C. Telephone Co. for a direct line to the Building Department instead of extension already being used.
- Statement of Ferry Receipts for the month of June was received and filed.
- Letter was received from the North Vancouver Yacht Club complaining about the discharge of sawdust from Horne Brothers Shingle Mill. Authorized that this matter ~~be referred to the Fire Chief.~~
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- 5th Authorized the approval of Drawing No. K-8800/2825 of the B.C. Electric Rly. Company showing proposed location for a pole on 12th Street west of Moody Ave.
- Authorized that the salary of A.K. Thomson, as caretaker of Horticultural Hall remain at \$50.00 per month for the whole year.
- Authorized that the Canadian Merchant Service Guild be advised that the Commissioner cannot accept the proposals contained in their letter of June 20th, re salaries of Captains and Mates.

Authorized that the Shell Oil Co. of B. C. Ltd. be advised that if the Company acquires Lot 1, Block 177, D.L. 271 and grants to the City, a strip of land 30 feet in width through the lands and premises at present owned by them above high water mark to connect Rogers Avenue with road forming North boundary of lots 18 to 25 of said Block 177 on a location satisfactory to the Supt. of Works, the Commissioner will close the road 20 feet in width forming boundary of said lot k, and petition the Lieutenant Governor in Council that this road be abandoned in favour of the Shell Oil Company in exchange for the strip of land 30 feet in width before mentioned.

- 25th 2 Authorized the approval of the resubdivision of lots 13, 14 and 15, Block 158, D.L. 271 Map No. 750 into the Northerly $62\frac{1}{2}$ feet and the southerly $57\frac{1}{2}$ feet.
- 3 Received application from R.R. Orr requesting that curb be installed in front of his stores on Lonsdale Avenue next to Safeway.
Authorized that Mr. Orr be advised that it will be necessary for him to do this work at his own expense.
- 26th 4 Received letter from C.P.R. advising that on July 11th Mr. W. J. Chinnick of 5737 Adera Street, Vancouver, while driving across the railway track in his 1930 Plymouth sedan was struck by the north gate ripping the top from the front to the back of his car.
This matter was referred to the Employer's Liability Assurance Corporation of the C.P.R.
- 5 Resolved that the Commissioner and Clerk of the City of North Vancouver be and are hereby authorized to execute and sign a certificate detailing permanent employees of the Corporation under the Unemployment Act, 1940.
- 28th 6 Police report for the month of June was received and filed.
- 7 Authorized that portion of the waterlot to the West of Lonsdale Ave. be rented to C.H. Cates & Sons for 2 years from July 1st, 1941 at \$50.00 per month, provided, however should the City require the waterlot for Municipal purposes at any time, that 60 days notice be given to Cates & Sons to vacate.
- 8 Received the resignation of Miss Andrews as a member of the Teaching staff of the City of North Vancouver.
Authorized that the above resignation be accepted and that best wishes be conveyed to Miss Andruss.
- 29th & 30th 9 Commissioner at Victoria on official business, re Dominion Housing Scheme.
