- 2nd Authorized that T. Grenfell be notified that the City cannot accept liability in the matter of damage to his car on November 6th.
  - 3 Authorized that cheque in the amount of \$500.00, signed by Jessie J. MacKenzie, be returned to W. D. McFarland & Company.
  - \* "City of North Vancouver Prepayment of Taxes By-law, 1942" was introduced and given 3 readings.
- 5th 6 Report of Police Department for the month of December was received and filed.
  - Authorized that the Burrard Dry Dock Company Limited be leased the St. George's Avenue Street End at an annual rental of \$500.00.
  - 7 Authorized that the following typewriter Companies be advised to carry on the servicing of the typewriters in the City Hall:

  - Authorized that J. W. MacKay be advised with regard to his claim for damage to his car on the North Vancouver Ferry, that the City disclaims liability as there was no negligence on the part of the ferry employees.
  - a Schools re-opened this morning after the Christmas Holidays.
  - "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1942, No. 1." was introduced and given three readings.
  - ""City of North Vancouver Prepayment of Taxes By-law, 1942" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.

    Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
  - Authorized that application be made to the Priorities Board in Vancouver to have the North Vancouver City Ferries given a place on the Priorities List.
  - Received copy of resolution from the Commissioner of Fernie, B.C. that the Province of British Columbia be urged to complete the Twelve Mile gap in the Hope-Princeton section of the southern Transprovincial Highway, thereby opening an alternate means of travel and transport in the event of the closing, by enemy action, of the Trans-Canada Highway or Railways in the narrow section of the Fraser Canyon above Hope.

Authorized that the above resolution be endorsed and letter sent to the Minister of National Defence containing such endorsement.

- 6th Report of Ferry receipts for the month of December was received and filed.
  - Received from the West Coast Salvage & Contracting Company Limited, blue print of Plumbing and Wiring of No. 5 Ferry in frame.

    Authorized that this be sent down to the Ferry Office.
  - Received letter from the B. C. Electric Railway Company that street lights were installed at the following locations on December 23rd 1941:
    Fell & 21st Street
    Dudley Road and 21st Street
    Dudley Road and Westmoreland Crescent
  - 7 Report of School Enrolment and Attendance for the month of December was received and filed.
  - Authorized the opening of a new Division at Ridgeway School necessitated by children from new houses completed under Wartime Housing Scheme, attending school.

Authorized that Miss Elsie Lamb be appointed teacher at Ridgeway School, commencing January 5th 1942, at a salary of \$950.00 per School year.

- 7th Authorized the execution on behalf of the City of North Vancouver of Agreement between the City and His Majesty the King for the sale to the Wartime Housing Limited of 200 lots for the price of \$200.00.
  - Authorized the execution of Lease between the City of North Vancouver and His Majesty the King (Wartime Housing Limited) for the lease of Lots 1 to 10, Block 142, District Lot 274 for a term of three years at a yearly rental of \$10.00 payable on August 1st in each year.

    The Lessee also agrees to pay \$540.00 each year for services common to inhabitants.

Option to renew for another three years is also granted.

- Authorized the execution of Collateral Agreement between the City of North Vancouver and Wartime Housing Limited re property purchased in the City of North Vancouver to build Wartime houses. In consideration of no taxes being charged the Company agrees to pay \$24.00 per year for each lot on which house with two bedrooms is erected and \$30.00 per year for lots with 3 bedrooms. Local Improvement taxes are to be paid by the Company. Sewers and watermains to conform to standards generally accepted in the Municipality.

  34 was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.

Authorized that Edward C. Bickle be appointed deckhand on the Relieving crew in place of W. Trebilco who was transferred to the permanent staff.

  - Received report from Captain C. Young, that at 8.45 and 9.30 a.m. in dense fog, No. 3 Ferry collided with the leads at the Vancouver side doing damage to leads. Referred to the Insurance Company.
  - Authorized that W. E. Ekins be and he is hereby appointed Dog 3 License and Poll Tax Collector for the City of North Vancouver on a commission basis.
- 20th Received reports from Capt. F. L. Coe and Engineer W. F. Merrick that No. 5 Ferry hit the circle at the Vancouver side at 4.55 p.m. \* Engine was handled as usual but did not seem to lose headway when it should. Reported to Chief Engineer. Referred to the Insurance Company.
  - 5 Received Annual report from the Ferry Superintendent on Ferry Receipts for the years 1940 and 1941 showing an increase as follows:-

- Authorized that the Wartime Housing Limited be advised that the City is willing to enter into another Agreement covering the transfer of an additional 100 lots to them under the same terms 21st and conditions as previously arranged - the Company to proceed with the building in the meantime, pending the necessary Governmental approval.
  - Authorized that Lots 21 to 29 inclusive, Block 166, D. L. 274 be 1 rented to the Burrard Dry Dock Company Ltd., for the purpose of making an automobile Parking space, at the annual rental of \$365.00 payable quarterly in advance, the Company to have the right of renewal for a further period of one year from 1st January 1943 at the same rental if desired.
  - Resolved that the North Vancouver Ship Repairs Limited be granted permission to erect a temporary store office on the road allow-ance St. Andrew's Avenue south of the Harbour Board right-of-way.
  - Authorized that the North Van Ship Repairs Limited be granted 1 permission to install fire main on Chesterfield Avenue and by-pass installation of six inch main on Rogers Avenue, they to take care of construction costs and work to be done to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Works. The six inch meter is to be installed inside the yard and become the property of the Company, the City to have access to read same periodically. Re the main on Chesterfield Avenue, it is understood that said pipe will become the property of the City.

    - \$15.00 per month increase for Fire Chief and City Treasurer. \$10.00 per month increase to Tax Clerk, Water Clerk, Cemetery Caretaker and Ferry Bookkeeper.

    - \$ 5.00 per month to Ferry Stewardesses. \$ 2.50 per month increase to Reserve Men on Ferries & Ticket Collectors.

Cost-of-living Bonus to all employees receiving less than \$2100.00 per annum. Heads of Households shall be deemed to include Married employees supporting a wife or husband or dependents - Also single employees supporting dependents. Single persons not coming under above to receive half the bonus.

22nd & Authorized that the Piano in Queen Mary School be repaired.
