- 2nd ¹ Authorized the execution of an agreement between the City of North Vancouver and the Burrard Dry Dock Company Limited, covering the Lease of a portion of St. George's Avenue lying between high water mark on the south and the northerly boundary of Lot 19, Block 176, D. L. 274 produced eastward across St. George's Avenue to north boundary of Lot 1, Block 175, D. L. 274 on the north for a term of 5 years from the 2nd day of January 1942, at a rental of \$500.00 per annum, payable semi-annually. The Lessee to pay rent and water rates but no taxes. The property is to be used for shipbuilding purposes only. Should tenancy be held over after 5 years, same to be on a month to month basis.
- 2 ² Authorized that Captains, Mates and Engineer officers on the Ferry be medically examined at the expense of the City, so that they are fit and proper persons to be in charge of the travelling public so far as their physical fitness is concerned.

- 9th ⁹ Report of the School Inspector for the month of February was received and filed.
- 10th ¹⁰ Authorized that Lots 16 to 19, Block 163, D. L. 271 be reserved until April 15th 1942 for Gordon Burdick.
- 16th ¹¹ Resolved that Fire Chief Murphy and Superintendent of Works E. H. Valentine, be and are hereby appointed Fire Prevention Officers for the City and District of North Vancouver for the 1942 Season.
- 17th ¹² Received the resignation of James Hedley, Ferry Ticket Seller to take effect March 15th 1942.
Authorized that the above resignation be accepted.
- 17 ¹³ Authorized that Geo. Malloch be transferred from the position of Ticket Collector to that of Ticket seller.
- 17 ¹⁴ Authorized that D. H. Gladwin be promoted from Relief Ticket Collector to regular ticket collector at \$100.00 per month.
- 17 ¹⁵ Authorized that J. C. Kirkness be appointed Relieving Ticket Collector at a salary of \$85.00 per month.
- 18th ¹⁶ Authorized that tenders be called for printing tax notices and financial statements.
- 18th & ¹⁷ 19th. Commissioner in Victoria on official business.
- 18th ¹⁸ Authorized the approval of B. C. Electric Railway Company Drawing No. K.8800/3015 showing proposed locations for poles on 4th Street, west of Mahon Avenue; 2nd Street east and west of Mahon Avenue and 1st Street, west of Mahon Avenue.

- 17th. Authorized that the Government be written to re Better Housing Loan, that a cheque for \$4900.00 be paid at once and 5 equal payments of \$5000.00 each with interest at $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ to make up the balance.
- 18th Forwarded to the Director of Medical Services, Statement of Heads of Families, Single cases and Unemployables on Relief during the month of February.
- Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief, Declaration of expenditure re supplying clothing and boots to eligible indigent persons for the month of February.

- 20th Authorized that tenders be called for Uniforms and caps for Ferry crews.
- Authorized that Mrs. R. Rogers be granted permission to solicit subscriptions in North Vancouver for overseas men to receive magazines.
- Authorized the approval of the resubdivision of Lot 28, Block 131, District Lot 274, Map No. 878, into the East $\frac{1}{2}$ and the West $\frac{1}{2}$.

- Estimates for the year 1942 were prepared and submitted to the Minister of Municipal Affairs. Same were duly approved and the Commissioner authorized that the necessary By-laws be prepared.
