 - Mr. McCarter, Architect for Wartime Housing Limited met the Commissioner, School Inspector and Building Inspector and submitted plans for proposed new School in the West end of the City to take care of children from the additional 400 houses to be built.

 Authorized that a recommendation be forwarded to the Wartime Housing Limited that the proposed new School they intend building be a Twelve Room School instead of Ten Rooms as submitted.

Fortin, Murray Brink & John McMahon, representing the Bondholders of the City of North Vancouver met with the Commissioner and City Clerk at 9 a.m. and discussed the City's financial situation and bondholders interests until 5:30 p.m.

A statement of Agreement arrived at re adjustment of the funded debt of the City was drawn up and a copy submitted to each member of the Conference. The Bond Committee stated they would endeavour to get the consent of 51% of the bondholders to the suggested arrangement.

Received from the Motor Vehicle Branch, Victoria, approval for the erection of signs on Esplanade creating a fifteen mile per hour speed limit between a point 150 feet east of easterly intersecting line of St. Andrews Avenue with Esplanade to a point 150 feet west of the westerly intersecting line of Chesterfield Avenue with Esplanade.

 Authorized that the Board of Trade be advised that the
 Commissioner has this matter in hand and is trying to devise means
 of regulating these workers. Several suggestions have been made
 but few are permissible.
 - 1 Received recommendation from the North Vancouver Health Unit Committee that another School Nurse be appointed in view of the influx of new residents and the extra A.R.P. work which Doctor Saunders has to attend to.

Authorized that an additional School nurse be appointed.

f The Solicitor reported re shippard workers jumping off the ferries - suggesting that notices be posted on the boats, signed by the Masters, that passengers are forbidden to disembark before the ferry is tied up.

This will strengthen prosecutions and will also be a protection against claims for damages.
