

APRIL 1943

- 1st Authorized the appointment of Mrs. Aileen King, 250 West 28th Street, as a teacher at Lonsdale School for the months of April, May and June, at the rate of \$950.00 per annum.
2. Resolved that the authority given by resolution dated March 29th 1943 to D. G. Tate, City Clerk, to sign all cheques, etc., for the Commissioner during his absence from the City, is hereby cancelled and that the Royal Bank of Canada be notified accordingly.
3. "City of North Vancouver Pentecostal Assemblies Church Taxation Exemption By-law, 1943" was introduced and given three readings.
- 2nd Report of Ferry Receipts for the month of March was received and

5. "The City of North Vancouver Debt Retirement Fund Trustee Appointment By-law" was introduced and given three readings.

7. Appointment By-law" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.
Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
8. Authorized that cheque for \$3.00 be sent to Mrs. J. Burnes covering cost of damage to her car on No. 3 Ferry on or about 5th February. The Insurance Company is to reimburse the City.
9. Authorized that application be made to the Divisional Registrar for postponement of period of military training for James H. Spencer of the Fire Department.
10. *See Page 78 cancelled.* Authorized that Lot 55, Block 167, D. L. 274 be granted to the Burrard Dry Dock Company Ltd., through W. D. McFarland & Company for parking employees cars from this date until 31st December 1944, the Company to pay an amount equal to taxes at the mill rate fixed each year. At the end of the period stated a further agreement may be entered into on a yearly basis.
11. Authorized that Special Evening Excursion tickets be honoured on the North Vancouver City Ferries in the same manner as last year. No new tickets to be purchased, old tickets to be stamped 1943.

14. Authorized that the tender of The Review be accepted, same being the lowest.
15. Tenders for Supplies for the various Departments were opened, considered and tabulated, when the tender of Paine Hardware Limited for Ferry, Fire and Janitor's Supplies, in the amount of \$1168.87 was accepted. These tenders are all exclusive of lamps.
16. Tenders for Paper Towels etc., were duly opened and the tender of Shoemaker, McLean & Veitch in the amount of \$696.49 net was accepted, same being the lowest.

- 7th 1 Authorized that the ladies of the Chrysanthemum Club be given a certain amount of turf and leaf mold, through the head gardener, Mr. Sam Smith.
- 2 Mr. Sigmundson, the Transit Controller, and Shop Stewards met with the Commissioner and Mr. J. McPherson and Captain J. Whyte in connection with the transportation of Shipyard workers on the North Vancouver Ferries.
- 3 Received report from Mate Hastings that on April 5th at 6.10 p.m. a young boy slipped on the stairway of No. 3 Ferry and fell to the bottom, getting a bad shaking up. Ferry had just pulled out from Vancouver. Sent the boy and mother home in a taxi.
Referred to the Insurance Company.
- 4 Received report from Captain J. MacPhee, that No. 3 Ferry, while approaching leads this morning took a sheer with the tide and bumped the circle hard when two lady passengers were injured.
Referred to the Insurance Company.
- 5 Received report from Mate Simpson, that arriving in Vancouver this morning at 8.20 a.m. No. 3 Ferry bumped the dock hard injuring two lady passengers:
Miss Thelma Muligan, 219 East 19th Street
Miss Louise Goodchild, 416 East 5th Street.
Referred to the Insurance Company.
- 6 Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 468 dated 3rd April 1943 recommending as follows:-
That George Washington Vance of the City of North Vancouver be paid a salary from the 1st April 1943, of Four Thousand, Five Hundred (\$4,500.00) Dollars, payable \$1,500.00 per annum as Commissioner for the District of North Vancouver and \$3,000.00 per annum as Commissioner of the City of North Vancouver, the said salary to be paid out of the respective municipal revenues.
- 7 Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 484 dated 3rd April 1943 rescinding Order-in-Council No. 401 appointing Harold Darling a member of Board of Debt Retirement Fund Trustees.
8 And appointing as at this date Harold Darling of 343 West 16th Street, North Vancouver, as a member of the Board of Debt Retirement Fund Trustees, under the Refunding Scheme.
- 9 Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 486 dated 3rd April 1943 approving "The City of North Vancouver Highways Dedication By-law Number 1, 1943."
- 8th 10 Authorized that Paul D. Marshall be appointed temporarily as Inspector of brushwood cutting, his duties to include Saturday afternoons, Sundays and Statutory holidays, remuneration, while on this work, \$25.00 per month on a 50/50 basis with the District.
- 11 Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 507 dated 6th April 1943 approving "City of North Vancouver Tax Levy By-law, 1943."
- 12 Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 508 dated 6th April 1943 approving "City of North Vancouver Percentage Additions By-law, 1943."
- 13 Authorized that application be made to the Wartime Prices and Trade Board for a license for the City of North Vancouver to establish a woodyard and act as a fuel dealer.
- 9th 14 Tenders for lamps were again considered by the Commissioner and the tender of Paine Hardware Limited was accepted.
- 15 "City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1943, No. 2" was introduced and given three readings.
- 16 Tenders for School Supplies for the year 1943 were duly opened and the tender of Clarke and Stuart Co. Ltd., was accepted in the amount of \$1993.62, same being the lowest.
- 10th 17 Authorized that the Superintendent of Works be authorized to

2. Received report from British American Securities Ltd., that the nuisance claim of A. Centro, who claims he was hurt on the ferry, has been settled in the amount of \$154.70.

3. Letter was received from W. N. Morris, 535 East 10th Street, stating that a number of chickens and one rabbit had been destroyed by dogs.
Resolved that the owner of the dog or dogs being unknown and after diligent inquiry cannot be found, the owner is hereby authorized to file claim for \$38.35 and that the sum of \$38.35 be paid in full for damages consisting of the killing of 41 chickens and one rabbit, same to be paid out of dog tax funds.
4. Received letter from the Manager, West Vancouver Transportation Company applying for changes in the waiting room at the Vancouver wharf.
Referred to the Superintendent of Works for report.
5. Authorized that Morgan Galpin, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Hodge and Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Ackerman be notified that they are trespassing on Lots 3 and 4, Block 152, D. L. 274 and that they be advised to move off same forthwith, Mr. Galpin to remove all buildings owned by him.
6. "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1943, No. 2" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.
Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
7. Authorized that a Special Grant of \$50.00 be made to the A. R. P. to be given as prizes in the Garden competition, vegetable gardens only, payable on a 50/50 basis with the District.
8. Received letter from the Minister of Municipal Affairs, stating that conferences of Municipal Officers Association will be held on June 7th and 8th and requesting that representative be appointed not later than May 20th.

RESOLVED that the resolution passed by the "Greater Vancouver War Chest" on 25th March 1943, that appeals to the public for funds for relief to the people of allied countries be included in or joined with some other appeal or combined together in one united appeal be and is hereby endorsed and that copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Department of National War Services, Ottawa.
10. Authorized that M. Wildgrube of Lower Capilano, be appointed spare man at the Fire Hall for holiday purposes.
11. Authorized that the Pro-Rec be granted 452 special ferry tickets for members going to Vancouver to take part in the annual display.
12. Received certified copy of Order-in-council No. 535 dated 10th April 1943, approving "City of North Vancouver Pentecostal Assemblies Church Taxation Exemption By-law, 1943."
13. Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 536 dated 10th April 1943 approving "The City of North Vancouver Debt Retirement Fund Trustee Appointment By-law."

This pipe is to serve the Industrial area.


