TO HIS HONOUR THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:

The undersigned has the honour to report :-

THAT on the 27th day of September, 1932, an Order was made by Mr. Justice D. A. McDonald, a Judge of the Supreme Court of British Columbia, authorizing the appointment of a Commissioner for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver, pursuant to Part XXIII of the "Municipal Act":

AND THAT on the 13th day of January, 1933, an Order was made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of British Columbia, authorizing the appointment of a Commissioner for The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver, pursuant to the said Part XXIII of the "Municipal Act:"

AND THAT GEORGE WASHINGTON VANCE of the City of North Vancouver, British Columbia, was appointed Commissioner for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver, and The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver, by Order-in-Council No. 620, approved on May 26th 1936:

AND THAT the said GEORGE WASHINGTON VANCE died on the sixth day of October 1944.

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT pursuant to the provisions of Part XX111 of the "Municipal Act" GEORGE H. MORDEN of the City of North Vancouver, British Columbia, be appointed Commissioner for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver and for The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver, in place of the said GEORGE WASHINGTON VANCE, deceased, his appointment to take effect as from the 6th day of October, 1944, and to terminate on the 31st day of December, 1944:

AND THAT the said George H. Morden, as Commissioner, be paid a salary of Four Thousand Five Hundred (\$4,500.00) Dollars, payable One Thousand Five Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars per annum as Commissioner for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver, and Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars per annum as Commissioner for The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver, and that he shall be reimbursed for all expenses by him incurred in his capacity as said Commissioner; such salary and expenses to be paid out of the respective municipal revenue collected by him as such Commissioner: AND THAT a certified copy of this Minute, if approved, be transmitted to George H. Morden, Commissioner of the said Corporations, and to D. G. Tate, Clerk of the said Corporations, at North Vancouver, B.C.

The recommendations of the Superintendent, as contained in his letter of October 21st, were gone into in detail.

RESOLVED that in connection with recommendations of the Ferry Superintendent, re safeguards to navigation, the Superintendent be instructd to:-

Interview Evans, Coleman & Evans and the Canadian National Steamships to obtain permission to install a loud speaker in a suitable location on their respective docks.

Purchase and install a new horn of greater sounding effect on the East lead on the North Vancouver side.

That the Superintendent interview North Van Ship Repairs with request that they install a suitable flood light on the stern of any vessel berthed at their most easterly pier and that a bell be sounded on the Vessel as required by regulations when foggy weather conditions prevail.

That Burrard Drydock be thanked for having installed a suitable floodlight on top of their high stationary crane.

That the question of installation of loud speaker on Pier 2 of Burrard Drydock be tabled, also the question of loud speakers on the ferries.

The Clause under General Remarks was referred to the Incoming Council.

- ". Copies of the Superintendent's recommendations were ordered forwarded to the various Captains.
- The question of the advisability of having two men in the Wheel , house and two men in the Engine room was referred to the Incoming Council.
- The question of Loud Speaker connection between the Bridge and the • Engine Room on No. 5 Ferry, was referred to the Superintendent with power to act.

The question of electrifying the steering apparatus on No. 5 Ferry \ was left with the Superintendent to inspect at the time of the Annual Overhaul and to report his findings.

- Notification of the appointment of Mr. R. C. Gibbs as a Justice of A the Peace in and for the Province of British Columbia, was received and filed.
- Letter from Mr. R. C. Robson, agreeing to act on the City Town Plann-⁽⁾ ing Commission, was received and filed.

Agreement in connection with the Metropolitan Health Board between the City of Vancouver and the various Municipalities belonging to w this Board was submitted.

Resolved that the Commissioner and Clerk be authorized to sign and Seal Agreement between the City of Vancouver and the City of North Vancouver in connection with Metropolitan Health.

Letter was received from Technocracy Incorporated, requesting permission to erect a billboard on the South west corner of 4th Street and Lonsdale Avenue, being Lot 14, Block 133, D. L. 274, owned by the City of North Vancouver.

The Clerk was instructed to obtain the wording proposed to be placed on this billboard before permission is granted. Letter from the Secretary of the Town Planning Commission with the following recommendations, was discussed: -

1. That any restriction on the height of dwellings be eliminated from the Commission's proposals to the Commissioner, dated 16th September 1944.

2. That no more than one single family dwelling be permitted on any one parcel of land in any residential area in the City of North Vancouver.

3. That the portion of D. L. 272 south of Keith Road and east of Heywood Avenue be taken off the City list of residential lots for sale, and placed on reserve for re-plotting.

4. That the Kinsmen Playground at 11th Street and St. George's Avenue be dedicated as a Park.

RESOLVED that recommendations 1 and 2 of the Town Planning Commission

be adopted and the necessary amendment to the Zoning By-law prepared. That the portion of D. L. 272 south of Keith Road and east of Heywood Avenue be placed on reserve for re-plotting. That the recommendation re Kinsmen Playground be referred to the City Clerk for report to next meeting.

Letter was read from J. J. Enwright, 712 East 7th Street, North Vancouver, requesting permission to use the Lonsdale School Annex for meetings, by a small group of young people calling themselves the Leadership Group.

It was decided that it was not advisable to grant permission for the use of School buildings but that they could use the Court Room in the City Hall.
