Briefly Mr. McLachlan asked that the City Council approve the work of the temporary Board now functioning, and he requested that some assurance be given that certain lands in Block 216 will be turned over to the Community Centre for their use.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Stewart that this Council recommend to the Incoming Council that early consideration be given to the representation of the present Community Centre Board of Directors on all matters pertaining to this project. Carried.

From Mr. W. R. McDougall, President, North Vancouver Schools Band, asking for a Grant in aid of the Band. Mr. McDougall was allowed to speak on behalf of this appli-

cation.

Moved by Alderman Humphreys, seconded by Alderman Millar that the North Vancouver Schools Band be given a Grant of \$75.00, said Grant being at the rate of \$25.00 per concert conducted by the Band during 1945. Carried.

From Mr. F. G. Saunders, Secretary, North Shore Transportation f Committee, requesting the City to pay one-half of the estima-ted expenses of the Committee, total cost of which is not to exceed \$50.00.

Moved by Alderman Stewart, seconded by Alderman Gostick that this request be referred to the Finance Committee with power to act. Carried.

From Captain G. R. Bates, suggesting that certain houses in Wartime Housing might be used for the housing of veterans. Moved by Alderman Walker, seconded by Alderman Millar that Captain Bates be advised that the matter of using Wartime Housing dwellings for Veterans' Housing is receiving the consideration of the Council. Carried.

From the Board of School Trustees, requesting the Council to 7 set aside a sum of money in 1945 for future School Buildings. Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that this request be referred to the Finance Committee. Carried.

From the Board of School Trustees, requesting that a Parcel of land in Block 216, D.L. 545 be transferred to the name of ' the School Board in order that they may begin their building a Gymnasium and Auditorium.

From the Union of B. C. Municipalities, advising that they do not consider that there is any great expense in the matter of advertising By-laws which have been passed on the request of > petitioners and therefore the Union Executive does not feel that the Shops Regulation Act should be changed in order to charge the petitioners with the cost of such advertising. Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Gostick that this matter be referred to the Solicitor for a ruling as to what would be considered proper advertising for such a By-law. Carried.

RECOMMEND that the West Vancouver Transportation Department be given permission to sublet a portion of their lease on the dock and waiting rooms at the Vancouver Ferry Terminal, providing that the Superintendent finds that such subletting can be arranged with the approval of the Solicitor.

- The Clerk reported that By-laws No. 1703, 1704, 1705 and 1706 " are now registered in the County Court at Vancouver. Received and filed.

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The Clerk submitted a report from the Superintendent of Ferries to the effect that Mr. John F. Parker had resigned as Engineer, his resignation to take effect November 30th, 1945 and that Mr. G. Allen, an Ex-service man has been employed to take the place of Mr. Parker.

Received and filed.

BY-LAWS

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Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Gostick that the WCity of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 12" be introduced and read a first time. Carried. Whereupon the By-law was read a first time.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Gostick that "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 12" be read a second time. Carried. Whereupon the By-law was read a second time.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Walker that the Committee proceedings be dispensed with and that "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 12" be read a third time. Carried.

Whereupon the By-law was read a third time.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Gostick that the "City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 12" be passed by the Council, subject to reconsideration. Carried.

Voting for: - Aldermen Copping, Gostick, Humphreys, Millar, Stewart and Walker. Mayor Loutet refrained from voting.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Stewart that "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 13" be introduced and read a first time. Carried. Mayor Loutet voting against.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Walker that "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1945, No. 13" be read a second time.

Voting for the By-law:-Aldermen Copping, Gostick, Humphreys, Stewart and Walker.

Voting against :- Mayor Loutet and Alderman Millar.

As this By-law required a three-fourths majority to pass, it was declared defeated.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Walker that as the use of this area for dumping ground had been arranged during the period of Commissionership, the Council do not feel obligated in any respect to supply this plan or alternatively to bear the cost of such a survey, but that if the Solicitor advises that there are no legal objections to the Company's request that further consideration be given to same. Carried.

The Clerk reported that in pursuance of the Council's instruc-, tions he had written to the City of Victoria asking for their policy regarding the payment of Superannuation of employees enlisting in the Armed Services and that he had been advised in the case of Victoria they pay the Employer's 7% of salary
plus the minimum amount payable under the Act by the employees.
Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Gostick
that the Council pay the 7% of the salary of employees serving or who have served in His Majesty's forces in this War
for the period of their service, providing that such employee
returns to the service of the City and providing that the

The Clerk reported that he had received a short term Agreement and explanation of the details of the cost of the proposed • Folicing Agreement which the Commissioner of Provincial Police wish to consummate with the City, the said Agreement to date from January 1st, 1946.

Moved by Alderman Stewart, seconded by Alderman Millar that this matter be referred to the Finance Committee for a recommendation. Carried.

The Clerk submitted an opinion from the Solicitor on the matter of licensing motor vehicles within the City. The opinion in brief pointed out that some of the operators of passenger Motor vehicles who charge for the conveyance of passengers will require a licence from the Public Utilities Commission and will also require a licence under the City Licensing By-law if they operate on any of the ordinary highways of the City other than Arterial or Primary highways. Ordered received and filed.

The Clerk asked if there were any instructions on the matter of the application of Mr. Ernest R. Owen to operate a proposed Bus Service between North Vancouver and Vancouver, this matter having been discussed at a previous meeting.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Stewart that Mr. E. R. Owen be advised that his application to operate such service should be filed with the Public Utilities Commission and the City Council will be notified in the usual manner when such application is being considered by the Commission. Carried.

Moved by Alderman Millar, seconded by Alderman Copping that this Council do now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole with the Mayor as Chairman.

duly elected School Trustees for the years 1946 and 1947, and returned their names to the Clerk of the Municipality.

More nominations for Aldermen were received by me than there were vacancies to be filled, and a Poll became necessary, and such Poll was granted by me and opened at the Horticultural Hall, Lonsdale Avenue and Twenty-second Street and the former K. P. Hall, now known as the R.C.S.C.C. "Lonsdale", Fourth Street West, both in the City of North Vancouver, on Thursday, the 13th day of December, between the hours of 8 o'clock a.m. and 8 o'clock p.m., and after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted with the following results:-
