FERRY COMMITTEE
Recommend that the B. C. Electric Railway Company be thanked for their contribution of a lump sum of \$4,000.00 towards the cost of providing the Bus Terminal facilities at the foot of Lonsdale Avenue.

Recommend that the plans of reconversion of Ferry No. 4 as submitted to the Council in Committee on this date, by the Ferry Superintendent, be forwarded to the proper authorities in Ottawa for approval and requesting an increase in the Certificate of No. 4 Ferry to allow for the carrying of 500 passengers.

Recommend that tenders be called for the reconversion of No. 4 Ferry in accordance with the plan submitted by the Superintendent, upon receipt of approval of the said plans by the Federal Government.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE - HOSPITAL Alderman Copping submitted a detailed report on Hospital finances and pointed out, among other things, that the net loss for the Hospital for the year 1946 was \$3,605.66 as compared with a net loss of \$8,593.18 in 1945. He said that the provisions of the Goldenberg report were being studied but at this time it was not clear just how much benefit would be received by the Hospital from this source.

Carried

NEW BUSINESS Moved by Alderman Walker, seconded by Alderman Goldsworthy that the Social Assistance Department be authorized to transfer as a many pensioners as possible from houses owned by the City to the seven rooms retained by the Corporation in the former Staff Houses and further that the two large families in the City owned Palace Cabins on East 2nd Street be transferred to accommodation in houses vacated by the pensioners mentioned above and further that the Department make every effort to have the Palace Cabins vacated as soon as possible by all tenants with a view to having this building removed.

The Council then considered the question of the operation of a Groceteria in the Staff Houses leased by ANVA.

Mr. P. A. Lewis, administrator of the Staff Houses for ANVA, was present and on motion was allowed to address the Council.

After a full discussion of the matter the Council decided to leave the matter until a report is received from the Treasurer as to what extent a Groceteria can be operated in the Staff

Houses without materially affecting the Insurance premiums.

that the Collector's Department be authorized to put the former
Staff Houses on a per suite water rate from February 1st 1947
rather than the present meter rate and further that the present meter be retained in use and a check on same made from time to Carried

The Clerk submitted report of a meeting of the Committee of the Whole Council, held on February 24th, 1947 at 7 p.m. as follows:-

"The Committee discussed possible alterations to Ferry No. 4 in order to provide additional passenger accommodation.

Mr. Chalmers submitted two blue prints and one partially completed sketch showing the various methods of alterations that could be carried out.

The third plan which was submitted by the Ferry Superintendent was estimated to be the cheapest of the three and called for

extra passenger accommodation in the centre portion of the car deck. This would provide an additional minimum of 100 passengers.

Moved by Alderman A. M. Stewart, that the Ferry Superintendent be instructed to complete the latter plan and submit an estimate of the cost of the alterations shown upon his being satisfied that same would meet with the Dominion Government requirements.

The Committee discussed the interpretation of the "Ferries Operation and Maintenance By-law" No. 1519 in regard to the Control of the Ferry Ticket Sellers, Collectors and Freight Clerks.
Moved by Mayor Loutet that the City Treasurer have jurisdiction over the Shore Staff dealing with tickets and monies and that the Ferry Superintendent exercise authority in the conduct of such employees towards the public and other employees.

Bus Service - Alexander St., Vancouver Moved by Alderman Copping that the Council request the B.C.E.R. Company to consider when possible, the institution of a Bus service along Alexander Street, Vancouver, to serve the North Vancouver Ferries after 6 p.m., in view of the fact that the traffic problem on Water Street would not be an objection to such a Bus line as it is during daylight hours.

Ferry Time Table

As there are no arterial or primary highways in the City of North Vancouver, the above law stands and is not affected by a taxi operator having a licence under the "Motor Carriers Act." Ordered referred to the Taxi Committee for their information.

3. The Commission replied to the Corporation's enquiry regarding fill material, advising that they had received their information from Mr. Gilbert of the Greater Vancouver Water Board. The Commission further stated that they were still in favour of a fill at the foot of Lonsdale Avenue as the best location for a new Bus Terminal and they submitted with their letter a plan showing diagonal parking of buses at the proposed terminal.

Stewart, seconded by Alderman McMillan that the letter from the Town Flanning Commission be received and filed and the Library Committee advised of the Commission's recommendation as to a new wibrary site and further that the Superintendent of Works be authorized to reply to that portion of the Commission's letter dealing with the cost of fill available from the Greater Vancouver Water Board, pointing out that the fill mentioned is not suitable for the purpose required and in addition is too costly. Carried

A letter from the B. C. Telephone Company in connection with the incorporation of the North Shore into the Metropolitan flat rate area was ordered laid on the table until the Municipality of West Vancouver make representations to this Council on this matter.

From Agnes Good, 829 Tobruk Street, advising that Crosstown Carriers are now vacating the office rented by them in the F. G. E. Building, foot of Lonsdale Avenue and asking for permission to remove the partitions constructed in the building by the previous owners of the Motor Cycle Jelivery business. Moved by Alderman A. M. Stewart, seconded by Alderman Walker that this request be referred to the Superintendent of Works with power to act. Carried

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman A. Stewart that the proposed rolice agreement for the year 1947 be referred to Committee of the Whole for consideration.
