# CORRESPONDENCE

From R. G. L. Guiliani, 1616 St. George's Avenue, requesting the Council to rezone a portion of his property on the North East corner of 15th and St. George's Avenue from Residence "A" to Residence "C" in order that he may erect multiple dwellings thereon.

The Clerk submitted a report from the Town Planning Commission in regard to the above application in which the Commission recommended that no changes be made in Zoning until the report is received from Harland Bartholemew and Associates some time this Fall.

Mr. Guiliani was present.

Moved by Alderman A. Stewart, seconded by Alderman A. M. Stewart that Mr. <sup>3</sup> Guiliani be heard. Carried.

Whereupon Mr. Guiliani addressed the Council and stated that he has plans to build a triplex, 2 duplex and 1 single house at this location and had gone to considerable expense in making a fill at this part of his property, so that there could be proper sewage arrangements.

Moved by Alderman Goldsworthy, seconded by Alderman A. Stewart that the necessary steps be taken to rezone the propertyreferred to providing that the applicant and the Corporation can agree on a suitable plan for taking care of the sewage from that particular area. Carried.

From the Army & Navy Administrator of the ANVA Veteran Apartments advising that his account books have been referred to the Corporation's officials for examination and asking that the rental of \$75.00 be maintained for the lease of the premises on East 3rd Street.

From North Vancouver School District No. 44, asking if the Council would advise the Board as to the former's policy regarding the continuation of the use of Wartime Housing dwellings in the City, this matter being of vital interest to the Board.

# REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

FINANCE

RECOMMEND that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign and seal a new agreement with the National Association of Marine Engineers of Canada, covering the Engineers in the Ferry Service, dated May 1st 1947, and incorporating the following changes:-

- -1- Maintenace of membership clause, similar to other agreements in force with the Corporation.
- -2- Increase in wages of \$15.00 per month.
- -3- One extra week's leave per year granted to bring the Engineers more in line with the Deck Officers.
- -4- Two additional statutory or recognized holidays to be added to annual leave.
- -5- Time and one half to be paid for overtime work performed in excess of the regular watch.
- -6- Engineers to submit to annual physical examination, and if found unfit the engineer shall forthwith retire from the service of the Corporation.

Alderman A.M. Stewart reported that Miss I. L. Tooth had been appointed to replace Miss Tremblay in the Treasurer's office at a salary of \$105.00 per month from 20th August 1947.

RECOMMEND that the Assessor prepare a map before the end of the year for Council, 6 showing the Assessed Value of City property now being sold by the Corporation.

RECOMMEND that the Superintendent be authorized to trade in the present two Garbage Trucks and purchase a new Garwood Load Packer and a new chassis suitable for mounting the loader unit, the funds to be taken from the proper Reserve Account, the cost of the Loader unit not to exceed \$5400.00 and on the understanding that the trade-in value of the two garbage trucks will be equal to the cost of the new truck chassis.

Moved by Alderman A. M. Stewart, seconded by Alderman McMillan that the above report of the Fianance Committee be adopted. Carried.

BOARD OF WORKS COMMITTEE

RECOMMEND that the Department of Indian Affairs be advised by letter that this Committee is agreed that a dangerous condition existed with regard to road entrances from the Indian Reserve on to Forbes Avenue, but that this condition has been to a great degree eliminated. Accordingly the Barricade was ordered removed at 12.15 p. m. Tuesday, 19th August 1947, and it was removed shortly afterwards. Mr. Taylor, Engineer of the Department of Indian Affairs, was advised that this was done on the understanding that the road in question be used only as an entrance by traffic south bound on Forbes Avenue on the north arm of the "Y" of the road, and by an exit from the Reserve by traffic proceeding south on Forbes Avenue, and using the south arm of the "Y"; that suitable signs be detected where the Recard joins Forbes Avenue. (Mr. Taylor agreed that the Indian Department would payed for signs erected); the committee further recommended that more brush on the east boundary of the Reserve for a distance 50 feet north and south of the road be cleared.

RECOMMEND that the Committee is further agreed that the road in question is only part of the hazard on Forbes Avenue. That because of the narrow width of Forbes Avenue, the large amount of heavy traffic using it, and the extremely unstable condition of the west shoulder of Forbes Avenue throughout the entire length of the Reserve, that immediate steps be taken to negotiate with the Department of Indian Affairs so that a strip of land 33 feet on the east boundary of the Reserve be dedicated for highway purposes.

RECOMMEND that in the matter of the roads connecting the Reserve with the Convent School and intersecting Third Street and also the road entering the south side of Third West of the Convent School Road, the Committee recommends that more brush east and west of these intersections along the borders of the Reserve be cleared and the School signs be removed and Road signs erected in place of same.

Alderman Copping reported that a By-Law will be introduced and read at the proper time at this meeting, covering the method of allocation of Taxi Stands in the City.

Moved by AldermanCopping, seconded by Alderman Goldsworthy that the above report of the Board of Works Comittee be adopted. Carried.

WATERWORKS COMMITTEE

RECOMMEND that the amendments to the Water Board agreement be discussed in Committee of the Whole after the regular Council business is completed.

Moved by Alderman A. Stewart, seconded by Alderman Copping that the above recommendation of the Waterworks Committee be adopted. Carried.

NEW BUSINESS

From G. Chalmers, Ferry Superintendent, enclosing letter of resignation from Captain J. A. Larsen, effective September 30th 1947. Captain Larsen in his letter of resignation said he would be pleased to help out in any emergency in the future, should he be required.

Noved by Alderman McMillan, seconded by Alderman A. M. Stewart that the resignation of Captain J. A. Larsen from the Ferry service, effective September 30th 1947, be accepted with regret and letter of appreciation for his services and his offer of help in any future emergency, be forwarded by the Clerk.

The clerk reported that officials of the B. C. Electric Railway Company had complained that due to cars parking on both sides of 14th Street East, during Theatre hours, their Queensbufy Avenue bus was unable to get by.

Moved by Alderman A. Stewart, seconded by Alderman Goldsworthy that this matter be referred to the Transportation Committee for report and in the meantime the Police Department be asked to check on the situation until such time as the Committee is able to report and a By-Law prepared if necessary. Carried

The Glerk reported that By-Laws No. 1815, 1816 and 1817 had been signed by the Mayor and Clerk, sealed with the Corporate Seal and registered in the County Court, Vancouver.

Station at the BusTerminal and asking if the Corporation would agree to a yearly lease of the premises occupied by them in this Building.

Moved by Alderman A. M. Stewart, seconded by Alderman A. Stewart that the B. C. E. R. Company be advised that the Corporation can only give a month to month lease as it is subject to 60 days notice to vacate under the lease with the P. G. E. Railway, but that it is not likely that notice will be given by the Corporation to the Bus Company to vacate unless the Corporation receives notice from the Pacific Great Eastern Railway Company. Carried.

The Clerk sumitted a letter from Griffiths and Griffiths, Auditors, advising that they have issued a report concerning the manner of preparation of the Annual Statement of the North Vancouver General Hospital as requested by Council, and that this report was now in the hands of the Finance Committee Chairman.

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman A. M. Stewart that copies of the Auditor's report on the Hospital Statement be furnished to all members of the Council. Carried.

The Clerk reported that Mayor Loutet had appointed the following as official delegates representing the City of North Vancouver, at the Convention of the Union of B. C. Municipalities, to be held at Harrison, B. C. on September 15th, 2 16th and 17th:-

The Council then discussed the application of Wallace Davis, 165 East 18th Street, to moor a house and float at the foot of Chesterfield Avenue. Moved by Alderman Copping that permission be not granted to Mr. Davis as it is against the Council's policy and against the interests of the City.

A discussion followed on the location of Taxi Stands in the City. Moved by Alderman A. M. Stewart, that no taxis be allotted stands on Lonsdale Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Copping that space be allowed for three taxis on 15th Street west, in accordance with the sketch of the Transportation Committee in this 5 connection.

It was decided that the Transportation Committee interview the three taxi operators at 15th and Lonsdale with a view to coming to a mutual agreement on the location of the stand for each operator.

WATER BOARD AGREEMENT

Moved by Alderman A. Stewart that a copy of the changes proposed by Council in this Agreement as summarized by the Solicitor be forwarded to Dr. Cleveland of the GreaterVancouver Water District and that he be advised that the agree-T ment is acceptable to Council, provided these changes are incorporated and further that the Council would be willing to meet him is he so desires to discuss the various changes.

Moved by Alderman A. Stewart that the Building Inspector be authorized to issue a Commercial Building permit to R. G. L. Guiliani to construct a store on the North 25 feet of Lot 2, West Portion Block 50, D.L. 549 providing the  $\delta$  construction is in accordance with the By-laws of the City and is approved by the Building Committee of the Council.
