Alderman Copping reported that a meeting had been held recently in Heywood Community Hall and those present had gone on record as recommending that the City install a Stop and Go light at Fell and Marine and also that a Police Patrol be started in 6 this area.

It was pointed out that Marine Drive is now an Arterial Highway under the jurisdiction of the Provincial Government. Therefore His Worship asked the Zoning Committee to discuss this matter with the Superintendent of Works and officials of the Provincial Department of Public Works.

POLICY COMMITTEE

Mr. Greenwood outlined the basis of agreement which provided that the Board would be allowed the use of these buildings on the same conditions and terms as last year except that the Board will pay to the City any increase in the costs of operation over and above the same period last year and would also make arrangement with the present Janitor to clean up the Buildings after School classes.

FERRY COMMITTEE

Alderman Cates reported that on September 22nd Ferry No. 4 q had been in collision, during foggy weather, with the Fishboat "Betty L". He said that the Ferry vessel had been handled by the crew in a very seamanlike fashion.

Alderman Cates reported that a man had jumped from the Ferry ramp at North Vancouver on September 26th and although attempts had been made to rescue him, these were unsuccessful.

Alderman Cates reported that although the Automobile traffic for the month of September was about 2,000 higher than the same month alast year, there was a decrease in passenger traffic of 51,365.

He pointed out that this was not a proper comparison, as in September 1949 children up to the age of 11 years were allowed free.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that the application of North Shore Realty to re-zmone Lots 2 and 3, Block 4, D.L. 273 from residential to business classification be not granted and that the applicants be advised

accordingly. Carried

The Clerk reported that it would be necessary to appoint a Court of Revision for the Voters! List, which Court will be held on November 15th 1949 at 9 a.m.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Stewart that Alderman Cates and Alderman McDevitt together with Mayor Goldsworthy be appointed as a Court of Revision for the 1950 Voters' List. Carried

From McCulloch Motor Co. Ltd., 303 Lonsdale Avenue, asking if the Council will extend the ornamental street lighting from 3rd to 4th Streets.

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman Suttis that this request be referred to the Fire and Light Committee for report. Carried

From the North Vancouver Remembrance Day Committee asking for a Grant of \$50.00, and also asking that an Alderman be appointed to act on the Committee.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman McDevitt that the above Committee be advised that the Council cannot make a Grant as requested as there is no provision in the 1949 Estimates for same. Carried

His Worship appointed Alderman A. Stewart as the Council's representative on the above Committee.

From the North Vancouver Civic Labour Association, advising that it will be sending representatives to the Council meeting on November 14th 1949 to discuss various matters such as the local Unemployment situation on the North Shore.

This letter was ordered tabled.

From the B. C. Electric Railway Co.Ltd., advising that the service on the inter-city bus routes between 6 and 8 p.m. will be increased to a 10 minute service and two additional morning hour rush trips are to be added.

Moved by Alderman Cates, seconded by Alderman Copping that this communication be received and filed. Carried

From the Memorial Community Centre, extending an invitation to the Mayor and Aldermen to attend the opening performance of "George and Margaret" to be held on November 14th.

The Council agreed to cancel the Council meeting which would be held on November 14th and the Clerk was instructed to advise the Community players that as many of the Council as possible would attend their opening performance.

From the Province of British Columbia inviting the Mayor and Aldermen to attend the opening ceremonies in connection with the Hope-Princeton Highway on November 2nd 1949 at 2 p.m.

His Worship asked that as many of the Aldermen as possible attend this ceremony and Alderman Cates and Alderman Suttis advised that they would be present on this occasion.

The Clerk reported that he had taken the complaint up with Sergeant MacAndrew and had also investigated the City By-laws and the powers of the Council in this regard and it was ascertained that although the City can pass regulations covering the size of the boxes which are used to convey fuel it has no power to inspect or regulate the quality of fuel delivered to consumers and that the complaint of Mr. Hargrove would have to be handled between himself and the Fuel Company as a matter of misrepresentation.

From the Department of Health and Welfare suggesting a new method of handling the accounting for drug services for social assistance cases.

2 Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Stewart that this letter be referred to the Finance Committee Report. Carried.

From Mr. Harry Smith, President of North Vancouver Neighbourhood House, drawing attention of the Council to the apparent trespass on the lots used by the children for playground purposes in the 200 Block East 1st Street.

Mr. Smith was present at the meeting and it was moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that Mr. Smith be heard.

Mr. Smith then stated that although he did not wish to 3 cause any trouble nevertheless he pointed out that the children in the area in the 200 Block East 1st Street had managed to clear a number of lots for playground purposes and that subsequently a Lumber Company had placed lumber on a portion of one of the lots and he asked that the Council take some steps to have it removed.

The Council agreed to leave the matter in the hands of Mayor Goldsworthy and the Superintendent of Works to take the necessary action to have the playground cleared of any lumber which had been placed thereon.

The Clerk advised that there were two applications which had been received and had not been accepted by the Council and he asked for authority to refund the deposits paid in this regard. The first of these was from the North Shore Realty to purchase Lots 2 and 3, Block 4, D.L. 273 this application having been made subject to the property being re-zoned from residential to commercial and such application for re-zoning

had not been granted.

The second request for refund was from Mrs. Margaret C.
Miller covering Lot 18, Block 22, D.L. 552. Mrs. Miller stated that since making application she had made a further inspection of the lot and found that because of the presence of swamp water it was not feasible to build on this property.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that the Clerk be authorized to refund the deposit of \$1177.65 paid by T. M. Malahias, client of the North Shore Realty as

a deposit on the purchase of Lots 2 & 3, Block 4, D.L. 273. Carried

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman McDevitt that the Clerk be authorized to refund a deposit of \$139.85 paid by Margaret C. Miller on an application to purchase Lot 18, Block 22, D.L. 552 in view of the applicants claim that the Lot is unfit for building purposes due to poor drainage. Carried

Petition was received from Mr. A. C. Huggins and 20 owners and 9 non-owners living in the 300 and 400 Blocks West 27th and West 28th Streets, complaining against the number of high trees in the area which are blocking the view of the petitioners. Referred by His Worship to the Policy and Legal Committee for a report.

### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES FINANCE COMMITTEE

Alderman Gostick advised that his Committee had met with Commissioner Sowden and had discussed the operation of the Social Service Department. Inasmuch as it was a joint operation it was agreed that the Department should be supervised by a representative from both Municipalities and Alderman Gostick advised that the Mayor had asked him to act as the City's representative in this regard along with Commissioner Sowden from the District of North Vancouver.

Alderman Gostick said that the Province is making arrangements for a third Social Worker to be added to the local staff. The salary of such worker would be shared 50% by the Government, 25% by the City and 25% by the District and the transportation for such worker would be shared on the same basis.

In view of the fact that the present Administrator is also handling a case load the Province is willing to pay \$50.00 per month towards his salary.

Commencing with the year 1950 it is the intention of the Finance Committee to set up a proper Social Assistance budget bin which the complete costs of operation including a fair charge for rental will be included and the overall costs of the budget will be shared by the District of North Vancouver.

Alderman Gostick said his Committee had considered the suggestion of the Department of Health and Welfare that the basis of accounting for drug services be altered whereby the Municipalities would be billed on a per capita basis for their share of drug costs to Social assistance cases in the area. The Committee felt that it was not possible to change the present method as better control of expenditure could be made through the local office.

RECOMMEND that no change be made in the present method of accounting for drug services to Social Assistance cases, it being considered that better control can be exercised through the local office.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman McDevitt that the above recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Gostick advised that he would leave the actual recommendation as to the hiring of the additional Social worker until the next meeting of the Council as there was a minor detail still to be settled as to changes in salary from time 4 to time.

In order to accommodate the extra worker certain alterations were required and his Committee recommended as follows:-RECOMMEND that the necessary alterations be made to the Social Assistance office for the accommodation of an additional Social Service worker at an estimated cost of \$210.00.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman McDevitt that the above recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Gostick reported that an agreement had been reached with representatives of the District of North Vancouver on the apportionment of the School debts of both Municipalities / for the purpose of School estimates and that such charges will be placed in the 1950 Estimates of School District No. 44.

Alderman Gostick then reported that the Council had received a financial statement of actual receipts and expenditures up to September 30th 1949 together with estimated
figures to December 31st 1949. He said that he expected a
satisfactory financial year and recalled the intention of the
Council to replace any reserve funds which had been spent
during the year.

His Committee then recommended as follows:-

RECOMMEND that the sum of \$50,000.00 be placed in General Works Reserve and that the necessary By-law be prepared. Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that the above recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Gostick reported that it had been found possible to take the necessary funds for the construction of the two concrete vaults from the Estimates of the Finance Committee and it would not be necessary to pass the By-law to expend this money from Tax Sale lands reserve.

RECOMMEND that the By-law authorizing the expenditure of \$3225.40 for the construction of City Hall vaults be drop-

\$3225.40 for the construction of City Hall vaults be dropped and that the cost of construction be authorized out of finance estimates.

Moved by Alderman Gostick, seconded by Alderman Copping that the above recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Gostick reported that the financial situation on the Ferries was the only black spot in the whole financial picture although this Department will not lose any more money than was estimated. It was calculated that there would be a deficit of \$28,000.00 without allowing for depreciation.

Alderman Gostick drew the attention of the Council to several items which appeared in the pamphlet known as the Ferry Log which is placed in containers on the vessels for the Ferry patrons. He said that items such as those which painted a rosy picture of the Ferry situation and drew attention to other matters which come under the jurisdiction of the Council, such as the advisability of placing hotels on Esplanade should not be in a pamphlet issued by the City on the Ferry vessels.

Alderman Gostick also drew the attention of the Council to the fact that new frames had been purchased for ferry advertising and that this was a capital expenditure, Council authority should have been obtained.

Alderman McDevitt advised that he was responsible for writing the matter for the Ferry Log but he did not have any idea that the publication was going to be censored by the City Council, it being a pamphlet containing very light material in a rather humorous vein, and if the Council was critical of the matter in the publication he was of the opinion that it should be discontinued.

q Alderman Cates said he would check with the Ferry Superintendent as to the purchase of the Ferry advertising frames.

ZONING COMMITTEE

Alderman Copping asked Alderman Gostick if he would consider placing any surplus funds in a Local Improvement Fund at the end of the year and Alderman Gostick replied that it was quite possible this might be done.

RECOMMEND that the necessary By-law be prepared to stop up Rogers Avenue between 1st Street and 3rd Street except that portion lying between 1st Street and the southerly boundary of Lot 28A, Block 156, D.L. 274.

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman Suttis that the above recommendation of the Zoning Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Copping advised that his Committee had considered the Reserve which had been placed on certain lots in the City for y future parking areas and library sites. He felt that some of these reserves should be removed and action taken with regard He recommended as follows:-

RECOMMEND that the reserve placed on January 19th 1948 on all City lots in the area from the lane south of 12th Street to the lane north of 17th Street and extending one block east and west of Lonsdale Avenue and including lots situated on the east side of St. George's Avenue and the west side of Chesterfield Avenue, for future parking areas be cancelled.

THAT the reserve placed on November 15th 1948 on Lots 1 - 3, Block 86, D.L. 548 for library purposes be maintained, and in addition this reserve extended to cover Lots 19 - 21, Block 73,

D.L. 548 (Cor. of 8th and 12th Streets).
THAT the reserve placed on November 15th 1948 on Lots 4 - 9 inclusive Block 61, D.L. 549 (opposite Fire Hall) for library purposes be cancelled.

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman Suttis that the above recommendations of the Zoning Committee be adopted. Carried

RECOMMEND that the following lots owned by the Corporation be

established as future Parking lots:-Lots 21 - 29 incl. Block 166, D.L.274 on the south side of First Street, between Lonsdale and St. George's Ave.

Lots 1,9,10, Block 63, D.L.548 on the west side of Chesterfield between 13th and 14th Streets.

Lots 4 - 9 inclusive, Block 61, D.L. 549 on the south side of 14th Street and the north side of 13th Street between Lonsdale Avenue and St. George's Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman Suttis that the above recommendation of the Zoning Committee be adopted. Carried

Alderman Copping advised that no decision had been reached at this time by the Committee as to his suggestion for increasing the number of Aldermen. Certain arrangements have been made however, to encourage a better turnout at the polls by providing additional polling places and by having a card sent out to each elector.

the Corporate Seal to a Contract between the Corporation and James S. Grant providing for the construction of two reinforced concrete vault additions to the City Hall, in accordance with the tender received from Mr. Grant, dated September 16, 1949 and in accordance with the specifications prepared by the Building Inspector.

Moved by Alderman Stewart, seconded by Alderman Gostick that the above recommendation of the Building Committee be adopted. Carried FIRE & LIGHT COMMITTEE

Alderman Stewart reported that the Chief recommends that tenders be called for supplying additional hose for the

Department.

The Chief also advised that it is possible to put in a Buzzer system and an extension of the Fire Telephone (North 238) betweenthe Fire Hall and the Police Station. This would be for the purpose of advising the Police Department when the Fire Hall is going to be vacant in order that the Police may call the off-shift firemen. Also the Fire phone would ring in the Police Department and be answered by them during the period that the Fire Hall might be vacant.

The Chief pointed out that radio equipment would be much more efficient and would give the Police a knowledge of all

Fire and Ambulance cases.

Alderman Stewart advised that the operation of the Fire Department had been discussed at a meeting held with Commissioner Sowden of the District of North Vancouver.

Alderman Gostick stated that he would like a report as to just what advantages would be derived by purchasing two-way radio equipment for the Fire Department, also as to which equipment was considered the best.

Alderman Stewart stated that demonstrations had been held at the Fire Hall by the Marconi Company several months ago and the results had been satisfactory. He said that the advantages of two-way radio would be that the Department could call the Police Department when leaving the Hall either for the purpose of advising them to call the off-shift firemen or that a bad fire required more Police help, or could be used in the case of an accident where the ambulance had been called. The Chief could also call for additional equipment to the Fire Hall or could stop additional equipment coming if he considered it unnecessary.

Alderman Stewart said the reason he had not asked for authority to purchase such equipment prior to this year was that the Finance Committee, early in the year, had asked that capital ex-

penditures be held to a minimum.

A general discussion followed and reports were read by the Fire and Light Chairman from the Fire Chief concerning the

operation of the Department.

Moved by Alderman Stewart, seconded by Alderman Cates that Fire Chief Murphy be asked to submit a report at the next Council meeting stating the advantages which would accrue from the purchase of two-way radio equipment for the Department also stating which equipment he felt was the best and further that he be asked to arrange for a demonstration of such two-way radio equipment during the current week. Carried

Moved by Alderman Copping, seconded by Alderman McDevitt that the Telephone Company be asked to extend the North 238 telephone line to the Police Department with the necessary alarm attached thereto, at an estimated cost of \$345.00. Carried

Moved by Alderman Stewart, seconded by Alderman Cates that the Clerk be instructed to ask for tenders for the hose requirements for the fire department, in accordance with the requirements of the Fire Chief. Carried

Discussion followed on a report from the Chief concerning the Hall; being left vacant at certain times and also dealing with the hiring of an extra man which action had been criticised at the last meeting of the Council.

Alderman Suttis was prepared to submit a resolution requiring Department Heads to reply in writing to any requests for information from members of the Council or Council Committees but His Worship asked him to withdraw such resolution and study the proposal which he, the Mayor, had outlined in his inaugural address in connection with information to be submitted by Department Heads.

BOARD OF WORKS COMMITTEE

Alderman Suttis advised that the complaint from St. Edmund's I Church of poor drainage in the vicinity of the Church had been taken care of.

He advised that "Quiet" signs had been placed in the vicinity of the North Vancouver General Hospital as requested by the Board of Management and the matter of Parking in the vicinity of this Institution had been studied and his Committee recommended as follows: -

2 RECOMMEND that the Board of Works Committee be authorized to take the necessary action to improve the Parking arrangements in the vicinity of the North Vancouver General Hospital in accordance with the recommendations of the Superintendent of Works in this

Moved by Alderman Suttis, seconded by Alderman Copping that the above recommendation of the Board of Works Committee be adopted.

Carried

RECOMMEND that the Superintendent be authorized to purchase concrete culvert pipe for the culvert under the Larson Road Bridge at a cost of \$3,500.00.

All the members of the Council present voted for this By-law.
