The City Clerk reported that the newly elected Council members, including Mayor T.H. Reid, Alderman M.B. Howard, Alderman M.A. Macdonald, and Alderman F.A. Taylor had been duly sworn in by Judge H.S. Mahon.

Reverend H. Nightingale of the Westlynn Baptist Church then gave the invocation.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that a vote of appreciation be extended to Judge H.S. Mahon and the R.C.M.P. Detail for their participation in this 1974 Statutory Council meeting. CARRIED.

## 1. ADDRESS BY HIS WORSHIP, MAYOR T.H. REID

" Honoured guests, Members of Council, Ladies and Gentlemen:

For the fifth year it is my privilege to present to the people of the City of North Vancouver the Mayor's Report and at this time I would like to take the liberty of thanking the voters for giving me the opportunity to represent them as their Mayor for a third term.

At this time I would also like to extend my congratulations to those who were successful in the election and welcome back to Council Alderman Marc Howard, and newly elected Alderman Terry Grimwood, Malcolm Macdonald, and Allan Taylor.

In 1973 the following was accomplished in the City of North Vancouver:

- (a) The new Civic Centre construction was commenced and is expected to be ready for occupancy early in the summer if there are no labour problems or material shortages.
- (b) The Silver Harbour Senior Citizens Activity
  Centre was opened. This is a great asset not
  only to the City but the North Shore, as it was a much needed
  recreational centre for senior citizens.
- (c) Our Water Works Program, which we have been carrying out for the last two years was completed, with the exception of the water intake. This will be

completed early in 1974. This upgrades our water system to accommodate a population of 50,000 residents.

(d) Under the Local Improvement Plan the following was completed in 1973:

Carry over of 11 City blocks from 1972;

6 City Blocks started and completed in 1973 with Marine Drive, Cotton Road, St. Georges, Lonsdale 26th Street to 29th Street, St. Andrews--Keith Road to 10th Street, 21st Street--Lonsdale to Chesterfield to be completed in 1974:

24 lanes paved during 1973.

- (e) A pumping station for sewage at the foot of Lons-dale Avenue has been constructed and is now working. Thus discontinuing the sewage discharge into Burrard Inlet in that area. With the installation of this new system most industries on Esplanade Avenue can now be connected into this lateral.
- (f) In the year 1973 there were 404 building permits issued for a total of \$28,209,864 \$21,715,920 over the 1972 figure of \$6,493,944, for an increase of 334.40%. The effect of this increase on our assessment and tax rolls will not be truly felt until 1975.
- (g) The 1973 Council set up a land bank which can be used for park purposes throughout the City totalling close to \$1,000,000 at today's prices.

1974 is going to be one of the most difficult years that the City has faced for financing due to the inflationary costs of materials and the fact that the construction unions and C.U.P.E. will be negotiating their new labour contracts. The effect that the energy shortage is going to have on materials has not been felt as yet but undoubtedly it will be shortly. The City is in the fortunate position that they negotiated a two-year asphalt contract and therefore will not feel the effects of the increase in asphalt prices this year. In 1973 materials were ordered also for the street lighting in the South Lonsdale area and work will commence and should be completed in 1974. The area designated is composed of 49 street blocks. This area covers Second Street - St. Patricks to Mahon Avenue, and Sixth Street - St. Patricks to Mahon Avenue, and embracing all of the streets within this boundary. This will make quite an improvement in this particular area of the City.

I would like to suggest to the new Council that early this year a traffic study be inaugurated to alleviate the ever increasing traffic problem. It is proposed to put before the taxpayers concerned, a Local Improvement for Esplanade Avenue from Forbes Avenue to the Low Level Road. If this is passed by the people affected, it could possibly lead to the beginning of a one-way street program.

It is inevitable in 1974 that taxes will have to be increased. At this time it is not possible to give an indication of what the increase percentage will be, however, the Council, as it has in the past, closely scrutinizes all submissions to the Budget."

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Marcino that the inaugural address by His Worship be recorded in the Minutes. CARRIED.

WHEREAS the District of North Vancouver, in correspondence dated October 25th, 1973, indicated that it would be prepared to meet with City Council on this matter following the November 17th Municipal Elections; and

The Clerk advised that this Public Hearing was being held for the purpose of considering an amendment to the "Zoning By-law, 1967", and the "Zoning Map of the City of North Vancouver", which map is an integral part of the said by-law, for the purpose of creating an "Industrial Area Commercial Use" Zone, (M-4), which would permit office and recreational uses in the M-l Zone east of Lonsdale Avenue, such uses to be limited to floors other than the main floor of a building. He noted that the proposed amendment would continue to permit accessory office and retail outlets on the main floor to the extent of 20% of the main floor area.

Mayor Reid requested that anyone in the public gallery be heard if they felt their property would be affected by the proposed rezoning.

Mr. Douglas Black, present in the audience, inquired why a restaurant use was not included in the definition of the zone.

The Clerk advised that his understanding was that the new zone would permit only such expansion which would not be detrimental to other areas in which normal commercial outlets were now established. He said the major difference would be in the parking requirements, inasmuch as a restaurant use involving the sale of alcoholic beverages necessitates a much larger number of parking spaces.

Mr. Black felt that rather than having the M-4 zone apply only to an industrial area, that the industrial area should be changed to C-2 Commercial Zone, thus avoiding land use contracts.

Mayor Reid stated that land use contracts were permitted by the Provincial Government in order to give municipalities an opportunity to gain concessions.

Moved by Alderman Howard, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that this Public Hearing now adjourn. CARRIED.

 Arpro Developments Ltd. - re Land Use Contract

The City Clerk advised that this item was brought to Council at this time in order that Council members may become familiar with the proposed development at an early stage.

Mr. Barry Briggs, representing Arpro Developments, requested that Council approve in principle their proposed development of the property which his firm controls at the foot of Lonsdale Avenue, in order that negotiations may commence for a Land Use Contract. He stated the property is zoned industrial, but their proposal would involve a development which would complement the area and permit public access to the waterfront.

Mr. Frank Musson, Architect, then displayed plans of the project, advising that this would be developed in three stages, the first being a marina, the second a commercial development, and the third and final stage a medium rise hotel, residential area, and entertainment centre.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that this matter be referred to the staff, the Planning Consultants, and the Advisory Planning Commission for further study.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that this matter be deferred at this time for consideration later this evening under the heading "Reports" on the agenda.

CARRIED.

3. Eastview Home and School Association -Permission for Utilization of City Property - Lynn Triangle

Mr. L. Dorais, representing the Eastview Home and School Association, summarized a brief which had been prepared by his organization and submitted to Council members. He advised that they would like to have the use of six acres of City-owned property located in Lynn Triangle, adjacent to Eastview School, for a period of two or three years, for the purpose of developing a fitness circuit, nature walks, and an ecological study area for students.

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that Council approve in principle the utilization of property in the Lynn Triangle area of the City by the Eastview Home and School Association; and that the staff be requested to report in conjunction with the overall plans for development of that area, and that the Association be advised of such plans.

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that the motion be amended that approval in principle be given subject to a recommendation by staff after having taken into consideration in particular the overall plan of the development of the Lynn Triangle area. CARRIED.

The motion as amended was then put and CARRIED as follows:

"THAT Council approve in principle the utilization of six acres of City-owned property adjacent to the west boundary of Eastview Elementary School, by the Eastview Home and School Association in accordance with the request outlined in their brief dated November 30th, 1973, subject to the recommendation of the City's staff after having taken into consideration the overall plan for the development of the Lynn Triangle area of the City."

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that this Council now recess to the call of the Chair for the purpose of meeting as a Policy Committee.

Whereupon the meeting recessed at 8:33 P.M., and reconvened at 9:14 P.M., with the same personnel present.

Association of North Vancouver and the City's Land Agent to meet with the Policy Committee.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that the residents of the Best Apartments who petitioned the Council to be permitted to remain in their premises until the 1st of May be advised of the resolution adopted by Council on December 17th, 1973, to defer the matter until February 14th, 1974; and that they be advised that the City is endeavouring to do all it can to obtain accommodation for them through the Greater Vancouver Regional District and the Social Service Department.

6. United Community Services - re Formation of North Shore Human Resources Society

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Howard that Mrs. Yvonne Schmidt who was present in the audience be heard on this subject.

Mrs. Schmidt felt this was a very worth while effort and was of the opinion that as many members of Council should attend the meeting on January 17th as possible.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that United Community Services be advised, in response to their letter of December 12th, 1973, that Council is prepared to discuss with them the proposal for the formation of a North Shore Human Resources Society.

7. North Vancouver Chamber of Commerce - re Request for Bus Service to the Foot of Chesterfield Avenue

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that the Chamber of Commerce be thanked for their interest in attempting to reinstitute the ferry service across Burrard Inlet; and that Council advise the Bureau of Transit of the Chamber's request for bus service to the foot of Chesterfield Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Taylor, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that this matter be deferred pending further information from the meeting which is to be held between representatives of the City, the City of Vancouver, and the Districts of North and West Vancouver with respect to the reinstitution of the ferry service across Burrard Inlet.

## 8. Inter-municipal Grants Committee

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Taylor that the District of West Vancouver be advised that the City does not wish to enter again into an Inter-municipal Grants Committee of the three North Shore municipalities. DEFEATED

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Howard that the Council of the District of North Vancouver be advised that the City Council wishes to reinstitute the Inter-municipal Grants Committee and that they be requested to reconsider their decision to withdraw from the said Committee, but rather to participate on the basis of a per capita amount to be established by the three North Shore municipalities: AND THAT a copy of the letter to the District of North Vancouver be forwarded to the District of West Vancouver.
