Mr. Bob Messenger felt that the interpretation of the M-4 Zone was not specific enough, in that it listed only one exclusion, hotels, and he wondered if the Board of Variance could rule on other uses, such as restaurants.

The Clerk stated that the inclusion of restaurants in this zone would not be possible and was clearly not intended in that a restaurant use would require a far greater number of parking spaces than normal commercial or industrial uses.

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Marcino that this Public Hearing now adjourn. CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Howard, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Mr. O.L. Hanson, who was present in the audience, be heard on this subject. CARRIED.

Mr. Hanson thanked Council for permitting him to speak with respect to his application for the rezoning of property in the 200 Block West 4th Street, which application had been refused. He said he did not basically disagree with the concept of a lower density, but felt that in this particular block the circumstances warranted special consideration, and he pointed out that the block not only was surrounded on three sides by apartments, but that there were two apartment buildings in this block containing four suites each, and one containing twenty suites, and he felt that this fact defeated the low density concept. He suggested that the logical place to commence the low density would be from the lane north of Fourth Street

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that this item be deferred to the Policy Committee meeting to be held later this evening.
