1. MINUTES

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council held on March 24th, 1975, be taken as read and adopted as circulated.

CARRIED.

CORRESPONDENCE

2. District of North Vancouver - re Cost Sharing of Recreational Facilities

Moved by Alderman Macdonald, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Council reiterate the resolution adopted on March 17th, 1975, to approve in principle the pro-rata population cost, sharing between the City and District of North Vancouver respectively, approximating 35% City and 65% District, for the sharing of the maintenance costs of those recreational facilities listed in By-law No. 4783, subject to agreement between the City and District as it pertains to the determination of the Recreation Commission's Budget, and that this Council request an immediate meeting with the Council of the District of North Vancouver for this purpose.

CARRIED.

 North Vancouver Chamber of Commerce - re Informal Meeting with Council

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Howard that the Manager of the North Vancouver Chamber of Commerce, in response to his letter of March 20th, 1975, inviting the Council members to meet; with the Chamber for the purpose of discussing which services in the areas of tourism and economic development the Council wishes the Chamber to perform during the coming year, be advised that Council members are prepared to meet with them on Wednesday, April 16th, 1975, at 4:30 P.M.

CARRIED.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, STAFF, AND COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES

 Ravine Lots to be Developed for Park Purposes - Recommendations from Policy Committee

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that

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publicity, (through the media), neighbourhood notification, and immediate naming and signing of ravine park areas and facilities be initiated in future developments.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Briathwaite that, until such time as ravine lots are developed, especially individual small lots, attractive "NO DUMPING" signs, with "Offenders will be prosecuted" should be posted and neighbouring residents informed of the eventual development.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by alderman Braithwaite that wherever possible the use of governmental local initiative programmes, such as winter works, should be utilized to clean up and develop ravine lots, this to be done, if possible, on a large scale for immediate development and use.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that, when considering the five-year or ten-year capital expenditure programme as it pertains to land acquisitions, priority be given to the acquisition and development of properties for parks and recreation facilities, primarily in the Lower Lonsdale area.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that a programme of park acquisition and development be included in the City's five-year or ten-year capital expenditure programme.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the Land Agent be instructed to submit a report on any ravine lots which are not covered in his previous reports on ravine lots or saleable City-owned lands, and which lots are presently zoned P-l or reserved for park purposes, in order that Council may make a decision as to whether such properties are to be left as P-l or reserved or dedicated for park purposes.

CARRIED.

5. Basic Systems Seminar/Workshop - Report from City Administrator

The Acting Mayor noted that the City Treasurer had requested authorization for one of his employees to attend a basic systems Seminar/Workshop during the period April 1st to 4th, 1975, and that in view of the short notice he had granted approval.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the enrolment of Mr. Larry Cornwell, Accounting Clerk III in the Treasurer's Department, in the Basic Systems Seminar/Workshop held from April 1st to 4th, 1975, in Vancouver, be approved, and that the registration fee of \$550.00, plus necessary expenses be paid by the City.

CARRIED.

 Land Use Contract - Gerbracht Construction Ltd. - 121 East 12th Street

Moved by Alderman Howard, seconded by Alderman Marcino that Staff be authorized to negotiate a Land Use Contract with Gerbracht Construction Ltd. for the development of Lot 6 Am., Block 85, D.L. 549, (121 East 12th Street), employing as terms of reference the guidelines laid down in reports dated February 25th, March 14th, and March 24th, 1975, from Urban Programme Planners, the Advisory Planning Commission, and the Technical Planning Committee respectively.

CARRIED.

7. Rezoning - Lynn Triangle Area

The City Administrator advised that unfortunately he had not had the opportunity to prepare a satisfactory report in time for Council's consideration this evening in connection with the proposed rezoning of the Lynn Triangle area, and asked that the item be struck from the agenda at this time.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the subject of the rezoning of the Lynn Triangle area be struck from the agenda.

CARRIED.

8. Four-way Stop Sign - 19th Street and Grant Boulevard - Report from City Engineer

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that a copy of the report of the City Engineer dated March 26th, 1975, dealing with the four-way stop signs at 19th Street and Grand Boulevard, be forwarded to Mr. John R. Wheatley, of 1844 Grand Boulevard, and to Mr. Robert A. Webb, of 1856 Grand Boulevard, for their perusal in view of the fact that their complaints initiated the traffic study at that intersection, and that this subject be placed on the agenda of the next regular meeting of Council for consideration.

CARRIED.

9. Board of Variance - Time Limit on Approvals for Structural Alterations -Report from Director, Permits and Licences Department

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Howard that Council recommend the adoption of the following resolution for incorporation into the Municipal Act and submit said recommendation to the Executive of the U.B.C.M. and to the Minister of Municipal Affairs:

- "A. WHEREAS Section 705(3) of the Municipal Act of the Province of British Columbia, being Chapter 255 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia as amended (the "Municipal Act") provides that the Board of Variance may allow structural alterations to a building or structure which is lawfully non-conforming to the provisions of a municipal zoning by-law;
- B. AND WHEREAS it has been the experience of Boards of Variance that applicants who have been allowed by the Board to make structural alterations to a building or structure pursuant to the powers granted to the Board by the said Section 705(3) of the Municipal Act have failed to make or complete the structural alterations allowed by the Board within a reasonable time;
 - C. AND WHEREAS it is considered undesirable for an applicant to have the right to make structural alterations to a lawfully non-conforming building or structure for an indefinite period;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT Section 705 of the Municipal Act be amended by inserting, after Subsection (3) the following as subsection (3a):

'3(a) In the event the Board of Variance allows structural alterations pursuant to the provision of Section 705(3), then the Board of Variance may fix a period of time within which the applicant shall apply for a building permit, and may extend the period of time so fixed, but if the applicant does not apply for a building permit within the period fixed or any extension thereof, any future use of the building or structure shall, subject to the provisions of this section, be in conformity with the provisions of the Zoning By-law.'"

IN ADDITION, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT this proposal be submitted to the Lower Mainland Municipal Association for their endorsation.

CARRIED.

MOTIONS AND NOTICES OF MOTIONS

10. Press Tables in Council Chambers -Motion by Alderman Marcino

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Howard that Staff be authorized to arrange for the provision of suitable tables in the Council Chambers of the City Hall for use by the representatives of the news media who are attending Council meetings.

Mr. Raymond advised that these furnishings had been planned for the City Hall but had not yet been received.

Discussion followed on whether or not the tables being considered would adequately meet their purpose.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that the motion be deferred to the next regular meeting of Council and that in the meantime the Director of the Purchasing and Properties Department provide a report with regard to the type of tables which have been ordered to determine whether or not they meet the satisfaction of the Council.

It was also requested that the Director of the Purchasing and Properties Department endeavour to obtain illustrations of the furnishings proposed for Council members to view.

The deferring motion was then put and CARRIED.

INQUIRIES

11. Gun Legislation - Alderman Howard

Alderman Howard requested that the letter dated March 10th, 1975, from Mrs. Maggie Burtinshaw requesting Council's support of a resolution dealing with gun control legislation, which letter had been distributed to Council members for information, be placed on the agenda of the next regular meeting of Council.

12. Sale of City-owned Lands to Individuals and Lands in the Town Centre Area for Recreational Purposes - Alderman Braithwaite

Alderman Braithwaite requested that the City Administrator advise as to the status of the above two reports which had been requested from the Land Agent two or three months ago.

13. Community Arts Council Lease for Old City Hall - Alderman Macdonald

Alderman Macdonald inquired when Council would be discussing the lease with the Community Arts Council for the old City Hall, noting that as long as the building stands vacant it will be subject to vandalism, as in the case of the fire which occurred on Saturday night. He asked that the subject of the lease be placed on next week's Council agenda, at the latest.

The City Administrator advised he had spoken to the Clerk today with regard to this subject and had been advised that arrangements had been made to have the lease and the necessary accompanying reports drawn up for Council's meeting next week. Acting Mayor Taylor stated he had been involved in these negotiations and there were only a few points left to be resolved.

14. Taxation re Provincially Expropriated Property - Alderman Marcino

Alderman Marcino inquired if the 33 acres of waterfront property expropriated by the Provincial Government were included on the City's tax rolls or will the Province pay a grant in lieu of taxes for that area.

Mr. Raymond said he was certain these lands would not be on the tax rolls for 1975 as they had been expropriated in 1974, but to the best of his knowledge the Provincial Government had indicated that a grant would be made to the City in lieu of full taxes.

Alderman Marcino asked that confirmation to this effect, or otherwise, be submitted for next week's meeting.

15. Absence of the Mayor - Alderman Marcino

Alderman Marcino stated that Council members are not informed beforehand of the absence of the Mayor. He felt this put the Acting Mayor at a disadvantage in the event any other members of Council required information which would ordinarily be available through the Mayor, and he asked that in future Council members receive a notification from the Mayor, with their agendas, when he is planning to be out of town.

RECESS

The meeting recessed at 8:25 P.M. for the purpose of the public question period and reconvened at 8:30 P.M. with the same personnel present.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Macdonald that this Council now adjourn to Committee of the Whole to meet in the Committee Room for the purpose of discussing several confidential reports in camera.

THAT Mr. G.H. Brewer, Purchasing Agent, be reclassified to Director, Purchasing and Property Services Department, with an increase in salary from Pay Grade 28, Step 5, to Pay Grade 31, Step 3, effective October 1st, 1974; AND THAT Mr. Brewer receive an annual salary increase effective January 1st, 1975, to Pay Grade 31, Step 4; AND FURTHER THAT, in accordance with 2the overtime compensation policy for non-union staff approved by the Council on March 1lth, 1974, Mr. Brewer's salary be advanced by two pay grades to Pay Grade 33, Step 3, effective October 1st, 1974, and to Pay Grade 33, Step 4, effective January 1st, 1975.

PROCLAMATION

Prior to discussing the regular business of Council, Acting Mayor Taylor proclaimed the month of April, 1975, as "CONQUER CANCER MONTH" in the City of North Vancouver as a gesture of its citizens' acknowledgement of the efforts of professionals and laymen who are involved in the fight against cancer, and urged the residents of the City to give generous support to the 1975 Conquer Cancer Campaign.

1. MINUTES

Moved by Alderman Howard, seconded by Alderman Marcino that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council held on April 7th, 1975, be taken as read and adopted as circulated.

CARRIED.

DELEGATIONS

2. Mr. M. Dunlop re Leasing of City Property on Jones Avenue for Development of Racquet Sports Facility

Alderman Grimwood left the Council Chambers during the discussion of this subject because of a possible conflict of interest, returning immediately thereafter.

2 Mr. Dunlop displayed a plan showing the layout for the sports facility proposed for this site, being four City-owned lots on the east side of Jones Avenue between 22nd and 23rd Streets, stating the main area of the building would include four handball and racquetball courts and four squash courts, including other accessory facilities such as saunas. He added that sufficient parking spaces could be provided to comply with the City's Zoning By-law.

Mr. Dunlop said the developers would be a non profit society which would be formed under the Societies Act and that there would be five directors of the Society, including himself. He noted that the total cost of the project would be in the neighbourhood of \$250,000.00. He advised that they were applying to the Recreational Facilities Fund for a grant of one-third of the cost and the remainder would be made up through debentures, and, as a matter of fact, most of the

remaining two-thirds had already been raised. He said also that the facility would be self supporting in that the operating cost would come from members' fees or from people who would pay to use the facilities.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the application from Mr. M. Dunlop to lease Lots E, F, G, and H, Block 204A, D.L. 544, on the east side of Jones Avenue between 22nd and 23rd Streets, be referred to the City's Planning Consultants, the Advisory Planning Commission, the Permits and Licences Department, and to the Technical Planning Committee for a report; and that, in view of the necessity to rezone the property for the proposed use, Mr. Dunlop be required to file an application for rezoning in the usual manner prior to any consideration being given to the application by Staff or Advisory Committees.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Howard that Item No. 9 on the agenda be considered at this time.

CARRIED.

CORRESPONDENCE

 North Vancouver Community Arts Council - Request for Funds

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that Mr. Ram Hira, President of the North Vancouver Community Arts Council, be permitted to speak on this subject.

CARRIED.

Mr. Hira said that Council had in the past agreed to lease the old City Hall to the Community Arts Council for the purpose of having a cultural facility, museum, and archives generally, and that they had been waiting for the completion of the new City Hall in order to take possession of the former one. He stated that they had anticipated taking over the premises prior to the end of 1974 and for this reason funds had been placed in the 1974 budget for the Arts Council. However, because the completion of the new City Hall was delayed they could not take possession. He said their main concern was a repetition of the fire which recently occurred in the building or vandalism of any other nature and they wished to engage custodial staff to protect the building, and it was for this purpose they were requesting the funds.

Discussion followed with respect to the use for which the funds allocated in 1974 had been intended.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that the request from the North Vancouver Community Arts Council for funds allocated in the 1974 budget for operation of the Arts Centre be deferred until information has been obtained from the City Treasurer as to the purpose for which the said funds had been intended.

CARRIED.

4. Task Force to Establish Community
Resources Boards - Letter from Anne Fall, Chairperson

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that a special meeting be arranged by Staff between Council members and Ann Fall, Chairperson of the North Shore Task Force for the Establishment of Community Resources Boards for the purpose of discussing the establishment of such Boards in accordance with the Community Resources Boards Act, for the purpose of assessing the social service needs of the community.

CARRIED.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, STAFF, AND COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES

Community Arts Council - Lease of Old City Hall

Acting Mayor Taylor advised that the final draft of the lease between the City and the Community Arts Council is not yet complete.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that this item be struck from the agenda.

After some discussion the motion to strike from the agenda was WITHDRAWN.

Moved by Alderman Macdonald that the subject of the lease of the old City Hall building to the Community Arts Council be discussed in camera later this evening.

A polled vote was requested.

Voting in favour: Alderman Marcino and Acting Mayor Taylor.

Alderman Grimwood, Alderman Howard, and Voting against :

Alderman Braithwaite.

Abstained from voting: Alderman Macdonald. (Counted in the affirmative).

The motion was DEFEATED in view of the tie vote.

Moved by Alderman Grimwood, seconded by Alderman Howard that this item be struck from the agenda.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Mr. Ram Hira be permitted to speak in connection with this item.

Mr. Hira expressed concern that time was running out for the Arts Council to operate a facility on the North Shore, and indicated his impatience with the way the matter had been handled by the Council.

'The motion to withdraw the item from the agenda was then put and CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Item No. 17 on the agenda, dealing with the stop signs at 19th Street and Grand Boulevard, be considered at this time.

CARRIED.

Four-way Stop Signs at 19th Street and Grand Boulevard - Report from City Engineer

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Howard that the petitioners for the removal of the four-way stop signs on Grand Boulevard at 19th Street be permitted to speak in regard to this subject.

CARRIED.

Mr. J.R. Wheatley and Mrs. R.A. Webb, whose places of residence are very near this intersection, stated that the removal of the stop signs on Grand Boulevard would enable through traffic on this street to move more smoothly and would thus eliminate much of the noise and fumes from "stop-starts".

Mr. Dunlop stated he was in favour of the stop signs remaining for the protection of children having to cross the Boulevard at this intersection in going to and from school.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the four-way stop signs on Grand Boulevard at 19th Street be removed.

DEFEATED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the City Engineer be requested to study the feasibility of installing four lanes for the use of traffic north of this intersection, i.e., four lanes on Boulevard Crescent to Lynn Valley Road.

A polled vote was requested.

Voting in favour: Alderman Grimwood, Alderman Marcino, and

Alderman Braithwaite.

Voting against : Alderman Macdonald, Alderman Howard, and

Acting Mayor Taylor.

The motion was declared DEFEATED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that the City Engineer be instructed to investigate and report on any practical method of improving the traffic flow at the intersection of 19th Street and Grand Boulevard, taking into consideration cost estimates for budgetary purposes, and including the feasibility of providing additional lanes or widening of pavement, signalization, or similar solutions.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Item No. 18 on the agenda, dealing with a proposed "Farmers' market"be considered at this time.

CARRIED.

7. Proposed "Farmers' Market" Report from Director of Permits
and Licences Department

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that Council adopt the following as criteria governing the operation of Farmers' Market installations:

- (a) Sanitary facilities to be available within two hundred feet of the site of the conducted sales, such sanitary facilities to consist of a toilet and hand-basin with hot and cold running water, soap, and sanitary towels. (Approval by Health Inspector required).
- (b) The proprietor of each facility to be permitted to sell B.C. grown bulk produce only.
- (c) The proprietor of each facility must be able to provide proof that he is the producer or represents the producer of the product for sale.
 - (d) The operation of a Farmers' Market facility to be confined to the weekends.
 - (e) In the event a Farmers' Market function is to be conducted on a public street, the applicant must first obtain permission of Council to occupy the street, and after such is granted must make application for a business licence under Group 1 Retail Trader, and accompany such application with the payment of a \$30.00 licence fee per unit, the applicant in this instance to complete an "Insurance Certificate" and to post a \$100,000.00 no deductible liability insurance policy.

- (f) In the event a Farmers' Market function is to be conducted on private property, such property must be appropriately zoned for a "RETAIL SERVICE GROUP 1 USE" and must not detract from other municipal requirements applicable to the specific property.
- (g) The area on and around the site to be kept free of waste and rubbish. If more than one truck is involved, one person is to be designated as being responsible for the maintenance of the site.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that Staff contact Provincial Officials to determine any legal liability the Corporation may have in permitting such functions in relation to the Provincial Consumer Protection Act, and report back to Council in this connection.

CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Braithwaite that Item No. 14 on the agenda, dealing with the Lynn Triangle area of the City, be considered at this time.

CARRIED.

8. Rezoning of Lynn Triangle Area - Report from City Administrator

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Alderman Howard left the meeting briefly during consideration of this item.

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Grimwood that a Public Hearing be held on Monday, May 5th, 1975, to consider the proposed amendments to the text of the Zoning By-law, 1967, as proposed by Urban Programme Planners, the Advisory Planning Commission, and the Technical Planning Committee to provide for RC-1 and RC-2 Zones; AND THAT at the same Public Hearing consideration be given to rezoning property in the Lynn Triangle area to RC-1, RC-2, RS and P-1, in accordance with the map prepared by Urban Programme Planners dated February, 1975, and attached to the report of the City Administrator dealing with the rezoning of the Lynn Triangle, dated April 11th, 1975.

CARRIED.

 Minister of Municipal Affairs re Amendment of Municipal Act in Connection with Amalgamation

Alderman Grimwood left the Council Chambers briefly during the discussion of this subject.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that Acting Mayor Taylor be instructed to contact the Minister of Municipal Affairs, The Honourable James G. AND WHEREAS the City of North Vancouver does not wish to provide parking for the use of downtown Vancouver nor does it wish to increase automobile traffic through City streets by non-residents;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of North Vancouver does not support a policy of providing parking in the core City areas for a park and ride operation; it is opposed to the concept of an automobile oriented drop and ride operation

for the ferry in the Lower Lonsdale core; and it will require that employee parking for B.C. Government employees be provided on site rather than on adjacent City streets.

AND WHEREAS insufficient measures have been taken by the Federal Government to alleviate this problem and to encourage Canadian families to establish and maintain their own privately owned premises;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities urge the Federal Government to effect legislation which would provide amendments to the Income Tax Act to permit the deduction of municipal and school taxes from personal income for income tax purposes."
