#### 16. Resolutions for submission to the 1977 Federation of Canadian Municipalities Annual Conference

WHEREAS the drug addiction problem is growing at an alarming rate throughout Canada, costing the Canadian taxpayer countless millions of dollars in law enforcement costs plus further millions of dollars in drug related crimes such as theft, breakins, holdups, prostitution etc., plus further cost of incarceration of addicts and pushers; and

WHEREAS it is estimated that in the Province of B.C. alone there are over 6,000 drug addicts using at least 2 caps a day which at the current street price of \$30.00 per cap costs \$360,000 per day or a staggering \$131,400,000 per year, which figures will be increased when calculated across Canada; and

WHEREAS it is further estimated that there are approximately over 600 addicts in B.C. Prisons alone at the present time at a cost to the taxpayer of approximately \$10,000 per prisoner which adds up to over 6 million per year; and

WHEREAS it is a proven fact that imprisonment of addicts neither cures nor eliminates the problem, but in fact because of the high profits in the illegal drug trade, addiction and its subsequent costs and crime have both increased throughout Canada; and

WHEREAS if steps are not immediately taken to eliminate the profit aspects of the illegal drug distribution, it is estimated that in 20 years time the drug problems and drug addicts and their related crimes and costs will increase over 5 times the present level; and

WHEREAS by making hard drugs available under a Government controlled program we would be able to decrease the inmates in our prisons by 30-40%, millions of dollars would be saved in decreased drug related crimes and 75% of drug addicts could become respected citizens and an asset to our society rather than a costly burden - in short take the profit out of the illegal drug trade and we would eventually practically eliminate the problem;

THEREFORE be it resolved that the Federation of Canadian Municipalities petition the Federal and Provincial Governments to take immediate steps to establish a non-alcoholic drug program which would dispense drugs under Government controls.
