#### 2. DELEGATIONS

Mr. H. Haggard, Chairman Civic (a) Arts Committee, North Vancouver Arts Council - re Lonsdale Quay Development

Mr. Haggard referred to the areas of concern of his Committee as outlined in his letter of April 30, 1980, with respect to the Lonsdale Quay Development, namely that the concept of the development of the Provincial lands be compatible with the guidelines which have been approved for the rest of the Lower Lonsdale Area. Mr. Haggard was assured that these concerns are being taken into consideration by the Council, the various agencies dealing with the development of Lonsdale Quay, and the Lonsdale Quay Development Board, to which the Council has appointed representatives.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that the Mayor and Council of the District of North Vancouver be advised that the Council of the City of North Vancouver expects the District of North Vancouver to honour the original arrangement whereby each municipality was to transfer all school properties to School District No. 44 (North Vancouver) at the time of its formation.

\*Alderman Cross and Alderman Marcino returned to the meeting at 9:14 P.M.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that School Trustee Mr. E. Sarsfield be heard on this subject.

CARRIED.

Mr. Sarsfield stated it was his understanding that all school sites in the City were transferred to School District No. 44 when it was formed, but that two sites in the District were omitted from the transfer. He said he felt this was an oversight on the part of the District municipality, but that the District is not admitting to such an oversight and is claiming the lands. He said it was his understanding that the School Board would be contacting the City Council to investigate the history of the transaction to determine if the school sites presently in question should have been transferred to the School District at the time of its formation.

Moved by Alderman Sorenson, seconded by Alderman Dean that this matter be deferred for consideration at the Council meeting scheduled for June 16, in anticipation of receipt of correspondence from the School Board. DEFEATED.

A polled vote was then called on the original motion.

Voting against: Alderman Cross, Alderman Payne, and Alderman Marcino.

The motion was declared CARRIED.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that, in the event the Council of the District of North Vancouver does not respond favourably to the City's request to transfer all the school sites in the District municipality to School District No. 44 (North Vancouver), that the Minister of Education and the Minister of Municipal Affairs be requested to prevent the acquisition of the proposed Cove Cliff site and the construction of a school at that location, as such would be detrimental to the taxpayers of the City of North Vancouver.

The City Engineer then displayed a number of slides indicating the projects in the plan prepared in 1977, which involved water and sewer systems, drainage works, street lighting, streets, and the paving of lanes, and outlined the works which have been completed, those which will be completed in the current year, and those scheduled for completion at a later date. He also advised of several projects, such as the waterfront park, which had not been envisaged in the plan when it was prepared.

The Land Agent noted that the program of land sales which had been anticipated in the plan is somewhat behind schedule, in particular, the Tempe Heights area, First and MacKay, 18th Street and William, and Lower Lonsdale. He added that the key to financing the projects included in the plan is the successful marketing of City owned property.

Moved by Alderman Payne, seconded by Alderman Kroon that staff prepare an update of the Ten Year Plan for presentation to Council late in 1981 or early 1982. CARRIED.

Mr. Scott, Mr. Moulding, and Mr. Leong left the meeting at 9:15 P.M.

(b) Stoker Farm Property Feasibility Study. (Recommendation of Policy Committee - June 2, 1980)

BY-LAW NO. 5275

The Acting City Clerk advised that this by-law was for the purpose of rezoning Lots 56 to 60, inclusive, Block 166, D.L. 274, (located on the north side of Esplanade Avenue, between Lonsdale and St. Georges Avenue), and Lots 59 to 64, inclusive, Block 167, D.L.274, (located on the north side of Esplanade Avenue at St. Georges Avenue), from M-4 Industrial-Commercial Zone to CD-22 Comprehensive Development 22 Zone, to permit on-grade off-street parking as the principal use on the lands. The applicant is Burrard Yarrows Corporation.

Mr. Morris displayed plans of the parking areas and advised that Burrard Yarrows Corporation, in conjunction with the expansion of their on-shore facilities, will be providing parking to comply with the requirements of the Zoning By-law. There will be provision for a total of 381 parking spaces. He noted that the applicant will be required to enter into a Section 215 Land Titles Act covenant to supply off-site parking on the sub ject sites.

Mr. Alsop of Burrard Yarrows Corporation was present and advised that he is in agreement with the plan as presented, and is satisfied that the parking provided will not cause Burrard Yarrows Corporation any hardship.

Mr. Alsop confirmed that the total number of employees is from 575 to 600 at the present time. He was unable to estimate the number of off-site parking spaces provided elsewhere in the area for the use of their employees.

Concern was expressed that a disruption in parking might occur in any future re-development of the subject property, and Mr. Morris noted that the City will require the applicant to enter into a covenant to supply off-street parking.

Alderman Cross noted that the Advisory Planning Commission had expressed concern with respect to access, egress and signage, as well as traffic movement in a westerly direction and crossing the double yellow lines in the 100 Block East Esplanade. He inquired if consideration had been given to the design of these parking structures so that access and egress would be accommodated through St. Georges Avenue and perhaps the installation of a traffic light at St. Georges Avenue and Esplanade.

Mr. Morris advised that the number of access points had been reduced from six to three. He noted that the City Engineer had been requested by the Advisory Planning Commission to investigate and report on signage, access and egress to the parking areas located on the north side of the 100 Block Esplanade consistent with good engineering and traffic flow criteria. Mayor Loucks asked Mr. Alsop if his company would be prepared to consider the use of right-hand turns only from the parking lot. Mr. Alsop advised that he would like to have an opportunity to discuss a solution to the problem with the Engineering Department.

Moved by Alderman Cross, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that because of the increase in traffic which will result with the development of the Lonsdale Quay and the concern expressed by the Advisory Planning Commission with respect to the traffic crossing the double yellow lines in the 100 Block East Esplanade Avenue, that the City Engineer in conjunction with the Director of Permits and Licences and Mr. Alsop of Burrard Yarrows Corporation, investigate the potential for problems of access with respect to the parking areas located on the north side of the 100 Block East Esplanade consistent with good engineering and traffic flow criteria, and report to Council. CARRIED

Moved by Alderman Cross, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that this meeting now adjourn to Committee of the Whole in the Committee Room to consider confidential reports in camera. CARRIED

Whereupon the meeting adjourned at 8:15 P.M., and reconvened at 8:39 P.M., with the same personnel present with the exception of Mr. Morris and Mr. Hawkshaw.

### 9. CONFIDENTIAL REPORTS

Moved by Alderman Cross, seconded by Alderman Sorenson that the following recommendations of the Committee of the Whole be adopted:

(a) R.C.M.P. Police Counsellor Project (Report of Personnel Directors, June 24, 1980)

THAT further to City Council's recommendation dated May 26, 1980 and District Council's recommendation of May 12, 1980, the Personnel Directors of the City and District be instructed to bring back a suitable contract to Council for the employment of the present Police Counsellors on a part-time basis for a term ending June 30, 1981, in accordance with the joint report of the said Personnel Directors dated June 24, 1980; AND FURTHER that the Ministry of the Attorney-General be invited to evaluate the program prior to March 1, 1981 based upon terms of reference established with the assistance of the Police Liaison Committees of the City and District of North Vancouver.

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(b) Lane Dedication - 438 East 7th Street (Report of Land Agent, June 23,1980)

THAT the Land Agent and the City Clerk be authorized to prepare the necessary legal documentation and Highways Establishing Bylaw for the property owner, Mr. R.V. Bunting, to dedicate the North 10 feet of 438 East 7th Street, North Vancouver, B.C., legally known and described as East Half Lot 17, Block 1, D.L. 273, Plan 1063, for the nominal sum of \$1.00, to the City for a lane allowance;

AND THAT the Land Agent be authorized to obtain the necessary Explanatory Plan to accompany the Highways Establishing By-law, pursuant to the Land Title Act;

AND FURTHER THAT the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign and affix the Corporate Seal to any necessary legal documentation and Highways Establishing By-law to complete the transaction.

(c) Lane Dedication - 2331 Western Avenue (Report of Land Agent, June 23, 1980)

THAT the Land Agent and the City Clerk be authorized to prepare the necessary legal documentation and Highways Establishing Bylaw for the property owner, L. Olson Construction Ltd., to dedicate the West 10 feet of 2331 Western Avenue, North Vancouver, B.C., legally known and described as North Half Lot 3, Subdivision "A", Block 215, D.L. 545, Plan 1064, for the nominal sum of \$1.00, to the City for a lane allowance;

AND THAT the Land Agent be authorized to order the necessary Explanatory Plan to accompany the Highways Establishing By-law, pursuant to the Land Title Act;

AND FURTHER THAT the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign and affix the Corporate Seal to any necessary legal documentation and Highways Establishing By-law to complete the transaction.
