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## 2. DELEGATIONS

(a) North Shore Winter Club Re: Classification

Mr. K.A. Cameron and Mr. M. Hamilton appeared on behalf of the North Shore Winter Club. Mr. Cameron referred to his letter of December 20, 1984 with respect to the property assessment and classification for the Club, and requested from Council a letter of endorsement in support of the Club's application to the Minister of Finance for re-classification from "business and other" use to "recreation" use. Messrs. Cameron and Hamilton then responded to questions from members of Council.

(b) L.R. Peterson, Solicitor Re: <u>Rezoning Application for Neighbourhood Pub</u> (1423 Lonsdale Avenue)

Mr. Peterson submitted and reviewed a brief, which was circulated to all members of Council, containing the following: 150

- Assurance of Applicant regarding residential factors
   Written summary of submissions to Council dated
- February 4, 1985
  Letter from Douglas Massie, Architect, to the Council, dated February 1, 1985 and dealing with parking requirements for the proposed parkade
- Copy of Architectural plans for proposed parking parkade
- Letter from Laurelton Investments Ltd. (landlord/ property owner) re agreement to construct parking parkade.

Mr. Peterson stated that the present proposal complies with the requirements of the City's Planning Department and should alleviate earlier concerns expressed in this regard. He requested that this application proceed to a Public Hearing.

It was noted that a letter had been circulated to members of Council this evening from Scot Simmons, advising that Whisper's Cabaret has an agreement with the City of North Vancouver and the owners of its building for the exclusive use of 27 parking spaces; and that any proposal to construct parking spaces would have the effect of interfering with their parking.

Mr. Peterson stated that the landlord is common to both Whisper's and Picasso's, and that he understands there are no legal objections to prevent construction of the parking facilities. Mr. Peterson then responded to questions from members of Council.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Hall that Mr. Scot Simmons be heard.

CARRIED.

Mr. Scot Simmons outlined the terms of the parking agreement for Picasso's relative to the properties located at 1423, 1433 and 1439 Lonsdale Avenue, in addition to two spaces behind their premises at 1421 Lonsdale Avenue.

## (c) North Shore Neighbourhood House Re: 1985 Grant Request

Mr. D. Sabourin, appeared on behalf of North Shore Neighbourhood House, and submitted and reviewed an addendum to the grant application already submitted to the City, setting out the financial circumstances and needs of the House for Fiscal Year 1985. Mr. Sabourin then responded to questions from members of Council.

Moved by Alderman Hall, seconded by Alderman Dean that the North Shore Professional Soccer Inc. be advised that the City is not prepared to grant the use of Kinsmen Stadium other than in accordance with the established policies which are administered by the North Vancouver Recreation Commission staff under which all other athletic activities in the stadium are governed.

Alderman Clark returned to the meeting.

## (b) <u>Zoning - Neighbourhood Pub - 1423 Lonsdale</u> Avenue

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Hall that the following resolution, adopted by Council on November 26, 1984, be reconsidered:

"THAT the neighbourhood public house rezoning application for Lot A of Lots 11 and 12, Block 49, District Lot 548/549, Plan 750, at 1423 Lonsdale Avenue, be rejected."

Botteselle be approved and a Family Suite Permit be issued upon compliance with the following conditions:

- Installation of a smoke alarm and a combustion air 1) duct for the furnace to the satisfaction of City Building Inspectors;
- 2) Execution and registration of a Section 215 Covenant pursuant to the Land Title Act, covenanting to discontinue the use of the family suite whenever such suite ceases to be used in accordance with the Zoning By-law;

AND FURTHER THAT Council authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute the necessary legal documents on behalf of the City.

#### (e) Family Suite Application - 1204 Heywood Street

Moved by Alderman Marcino, seconded by Alderman Dean that the application to install a family suite in the dwelling 3. at 1204 Heywood Street, Lot 18, Block 7, D.L. 272, received from Ms. C. Archer be approved and a Family Suite Permit be issued upon compliance with the following conditions:

- installation of a smoke alarm; application and completion of building and 2) electrical permits;
- 3) execution and registration of a Section 215 Covenant pursuant to the Land Title Act, covenanting to discontinue the use of the family suite whenever such suite ceases to be used in accordance with the Zoning By-law;

AND FURTHER THAT Council authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the necessary legal documents on behalf of the City.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

(f) Exemption from Noise Control By-law - Gama Construction re Pinecorp Research Centre (Lonsdale Quay)

Report: Director, Development and Licensing Services -January 31, 1985.

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Moved by Alderman Hall, seconded by Alderman Clark that the application by Gama Construction for exemption under Section 401 of the City's Noise Control By-law No. 5465 be granted subject to the following conditions:

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- That the first period of exemption be for a maximum of 30 days, with a commencement date of February 18th, 1985.
- That during the period of exemption Gama Construction be permitted to conduct their construction activities from 0700 hours to 2300 hours on weekdays and Saturdays and 0900 hours to 1700 hours on Sundays.
- 3. That during the period of exemption Gama Construction be required to make a conscientious effort to schedule the noisiest of their operations to daytime hours as defined in the By-law.
- 4. That any need to change such scheduling be preceded by notification to the Noise Control Officer, so that he may have the opportunity of adjudicating the situation and prepare for the resultant complaints that may be received.
- 5. Construction when required of a temporary noise barrier to the specifications of the Noise Control Officer at different locations on site, should the Noise Control Officer perceive a need and determine there is a reasonable solution.
- 6. That Gama Construction be required to notify in writing the Managers of residential buildings within a 400 foot radius of the construction site of their construction schedule and provide within the notification both Gama's telephone number for complaints as well as the telephone number of the North Shore Health Department.

Because of the adjacency of the Mission Indian Reserve Number 1, and the fact that the Reserve is not really within our jurisdiction, Gamma be required to deliver the same notice to the officer of the Squamish Indian Band located at 345 West 5th Street, North Vancouver, B.C.

- 7. That Gama Construction be required to submit an application for renewal and extension of this exemption by no later than Wednesday, March 6th, 1985.
- 8. That Gama Construction are required to give a minimum 24 hour notice with respect to any required trades inspection service to be conducted by the City Staff.
- 9. That Gama Construction be advised that the City's Engineering Department services are available only between the hours of 8:00 A.M., and 4:00 P.M., and beyond these hours only emergency response is available.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Taylor that the motion be amended by deleting "0700 hours to 2300 hours on weekdays" in section 2 and substituting therefor "0700 hours to 2100 hours on weekdays".

DEFEATED.

Moved by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Taylor that the motion be amended by deleting "0900 hours to 1700 hours on Sundays" in section 2 and substituting therefor "1000 hours to 1700 hours on Sundays".

DEFEATED.

The question on the original motion was then put and CARRIED.

Alderman Dean is recorded as voting contrary to the motion.

Report: Director, Development and Licensing Services -January 31, 1985.

Moved by Alderman Clark, seconded by Alderman Marcino that the application by Beta Construction for exemption under Section 401 of the City's Noise Control By-law No. 5465 be granted subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the first period of exemption be for a maximum of 30 days commencement from the date of adoption of this resolution.
- 2. That during the period of exemption Beta Construction be permitted to conduct their construction activities up to a maximum of 10:00 P.M., on any single occasion with a permitted frequency of only twice a week (Sunday to Saturday).
- 3. The construction activity permitted in this exemption is for purposes of power trowelling concrete slabs only, no other night-time construction activity is permitted during the period of this exemption.
- 4. That during the period of exemption Beta Construction is required to make a conscientious effort to minimize their construction noise.
- 5. That during the period of exemption Beta Construction be required to notify the Noise Control Officer of any intended change to the schedule so that he may have the opportunity of adjudicating the situation and prepare for the resultant complaints that may be received.
- 6. That Beta Construction be required to notify in writing the Managers of residential buildings on the northside of 15th Street, 100 and 200 Block East, southside of 15th Street, 100 Block East, northside of 14th, 100 Block East, 1st and 2nd buildings southside 13th, 200 Block East (East of St. George's), residential buildings northeast corner 12th and St. George's, of their construction schedule and provide within the notification both Beta's telephone number for complaints as well as the telephone number of the North Shore Health Department.

Because of the adjacency of the hospital and the need to be sensitive to the acute care facility Beta Construction is required to deliver the same notice to the Hospital Administrator, 230 East 13th Street, North Vancouver.

- 7. That Beta Construction be required to submit the application for renewal and extension of this exemption by no later than February 20, 1985.
- 8. That Beta Construction are required to give a minimum 24 hour notice with respect to any required trades inspection service to be conducted by the City Staff.

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<sup>(</sup>g) Exemption from Noise Control By-law - Beta Construction re Bastion Development Ltd. (St. Georges Avenue at 14th Street)

9. That Beta Construction be advised that the City's Engineering Department services are available only between the hours of 8:00 A.M., and 4:00 P.M., and beyond these hours only emergency response is available.

Moved by Alderman Clark, seconded by Alderman Marcino that the motion be amended by adding section 10, as follows:

"10. That Beta Construction must ensure that emergency vehicles discharging from the Lions Gate Hospital are not obstructed in any way."

CARRIED.

The motion as amended was then put and <u>CARRIED</u> UNANIMOUSLY.

 (a) <u>Social Escort Service</u> Notice of Motion by Alderman Braithwaite.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that:

WHEREAS a business licence has been recently granted to establish an escort business in the City of North Vancouver; and

WHEREAS staff are in the process of amending the Business Licence By-law as it pertains to Social Escort Services in order to provide for greater scrutiny of these operations; and

WHEREAS members of City Council in their deliberations have expressed grave concern with the decision of allowing such a business in the City; and

WHEREAS allowing such a business in our City could easily become a front for prostitution and could probably attract unsavory individuals; and

WHEREAS since there are a number of escort services operating in Vancouver and in other municipalities in the Lower Mainland; and

WHEREAS it is my opinion, and I sense the feeling of Council members, that in the best interests of the citizens of the City and individuals (especially women), who might be exploited by this business that such a business (service) should not be encouraged to establish in this City;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of North Vancouver reconsider and rescind Section 516 of the Business Licence By-law, 1973, No. 4513, under the heading of "Social Escort Service";

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any reference to this By-law referred to in Schedule 'A' and Table 1B of Schedule 'B' for calculation of the licence fee be also reconsidered and rescinded.

Moved by Alderman Braithwaite, seconded by Alderman Marcino that consideration of this subject be tabled pending receipt of a staff report. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. , 1.
