Ms. J. Bryant and others referred to the petition submitted to Council, in which it was requested that Lot 2, Block 19, District Lot 552, Plan 15874 be dedicated as a greenbelt, on the basis that it is physically, aesthetically and economically unsuitable for development.

(b) David & Gail McKinnon, 1959 MacKay Avenue and Alex & Louise Ferguson, 1949 MacKay Avenue

Re: Greenbelt Dedication of Lot 2, Block 19, District Lot 552, Plan 15874.

Mr. McKinnon stated he is opposed to the suggestion that Lot 2, Block 19, District Lot 552, Plan 15874 be declared as a greenbelt for the following reasons: it is used as a dumping area; few children play there; security risks for homes and children, and the close proximity of Heywood and Sowden Parks.

Ms. L. Ferguson advised that the potential exists to subdivide her property at 1949 MacKay Avenue, and requested that Council make an early decision with respect to the City-owned Lot 2, Block 19, District Lot 552, Plan 15874.

(c) Charmagne George and Joan McGinnes, #1-124 East 19th Street
