AND THAT a copy of this report be sent to the Ministry of Labour and Consumer Services to assist them in bringing to the attention of other B C Municipalities the concern that their obsolete schedule of fees probably results in significant subsidy by their taxpayers of their cemetery operations and maintenance

- 3 Requires payment of interest which gobbles up approximately 1/3 of all government revenues severely limiting the ability of the Government of Canada to plan or manage its programs effectively

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of North Vancouver write to the Prime Minister of Canada and the Minister of Finance strongly suggesting that

- 1 A State of National Fiscal Emergency be declared immediately
- 2 Federal Deficits be eliminated over the next three years with a balanced budget a requirement in law starting in 1996
- 3 Any GST surplus over projections in 1991 be used in its entirety in immediate reduction of the Federal Debt and
- In future years a percentage of the GST (based on elimination of the Federal Debt over the next 25 years) be solely applied to reduction of the Federal Debt

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be submitted to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities for circulation to all municipalities in Canada asking for their endorsation of this resolution and that they write the Prime Minister and Minister of Finance advising of their support of it
