Election signs are permitted in the following locations subject to the conditions in Section B 2:

- On Heywood Street from 3rd Street to the Lane North of 3rd Street;
- c. Shavington & Gladstone Right of Way (6 feet);
- d. Grand Boulevard from 22nd to 23rd but not within 30 metres of bend.

#### 1.2 Group 2

On boulevards where there is no abutting private property:

- a. Low Level Road from Kennard to St. Patrick's Avenue;
- b. The South-side of Alder Street from St. David's to St. Patrick's;
- c. The East-side of Queensbury; 21st to the lane North of 22nd Street;
- d. The East-side of Grand Boulevard; 20th to 22nd Street;
- e. The East-side of Fell Avenue; 18th to the lane North of 19th Street;
- f. The West and South-side of Casano Boulevard.

- 2. Election signs must be placed so as to comply with the following conditions:

  - 3.1 canvass or solicit votes or otherwise attempt to influence how an elector votes;
  - 3.2 carry, wear or supply a flag, badge or other thing indicating that the person using it is a supporter of a particular candidate or elector organization;
  - 3.3 display or distribute a sign, a document or other material regarding a candidate or elector organization, except as authorized by the Chief Election Officer;
  - 3.4 display, distribute, post or openly leave a representation of a ballot marked for a particular candidate in the current election.

4. The following is an excerpt from the City of North Vancouver "Street and Traffic Bylaw 1991, No. 6234" provided for information:
