WHEREAS the City of North Vancouver Council recognizes that the danger of nuclear weapons threatens our very existence;

AND WHEREAS a number of significant Canadian organizations and individuals support the World Court Project initiative to seek an advisory opinion on the legality of nuclear weapons from the International Court of Justice;

AND WHEREAS the World Federation of Public Health Associations, at its May 1993 meeting, unanimously passed a resolution endorsing the World Court Project initiative;

AND WHEREAS over a hundred nations, meeting at the World Health Assembly of the World Health Organization, voted on May 14, 1993, by an overwhelming margin to support the World Court Project initiative;

AND WHEREAS a majority of nations, meeting at the United Nations General Assembly voted on December 15, 1994 to support the World Court Project initiative;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of North Vancouver Council endorses and supports the initiative to request an advisory opinion from the International Court of Justice on the legality of nuclear weapons, and encourages the Canadian government to submit a legal brief to the Court arguing that the use of nuclear weapons is illegal under international law.

AND WHEREAS Canada has the highest production of domestic waste per capita in the world and a disposal crisis threatens many areas of the country, including Canada's big cities;

AND WHEREAS other countries have 50% less packaging waste in Canada and continue to reduce packaging waste;

AND WHEREAS concerted action through strong Federal leadership is required to address the complex and challenging waste management issues and to achieve a national strategy to reduce the amount of waste we produce in Canada;

AND WHEREAS NAPP was given the highest priority among environmental issues with the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM);

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the City of North Vancouver urge the Federal Government to reaffirm its commitment to NAPP and the targets and policies of the Protocol;

AND THAT IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Council of the City of North Vancouver urge the Federal Government to recognize through NAPP the importance of environmentally friendly packaging for Canadian products and the Canadian economy.
