## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. THAT the Council of The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver is strongly supportive of a united Canada, a nation which has earned international recognition as being one of the best countries in the world, and believes that continued Quebec membership in the Canadian Confederation is essential for maintaining that quality of nationhood and indeed, separation of Quebec would not only deprive us of an important national quality but would also seriously threaten Canada with disintegration, and
- 2. THAT we assert the belief that rejection of proposals for constitutional change which has occurred during the past few years, does not mean that Canadians refuse to recognize that change and reform of confederation is both necessary and desirable and that British Columbians, along with people from all regions of Canada, recognize the need for change;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT we send a warm message to the people of Quebec, telling them that they are very much wanted and needed as part of Canada, a nation which will have the capacity to grow, evolve and change in order to meet the needs of its citizens in all of its varied and different parts.
