THAT on the assumption that the appointed School Board Trustee can enter into agreements and can commit the necessary resources to meet the North Vancouver School District No. 44's obligations under the terms of the agreements:

- 1. The Master Agreement be ratified, subject to ratification by the other partners.
- 2. The Specific Joint Use Agreement on Fields be put on hold pending resolution of the School Board situation.
- 3. The City of North Vancouver and the District of North Vancouver and the School District No. 44 explore the feasibility of establishing a jointly funded planning position (or secondment of an existing planning position to work out of the School Board office) in order to improve communications and joint planning between the jurisdictions around school/municipal issues and to maximize the opportunities for joint facility planning.
- 4. The Joint Planning Team be charged with the responsibility of investigating opportunities for partnerships such as the expansion of the Seycove Secondary and Larson Elementary and the construction of a school serving the Parkway Village/Windsong area and Northlands and Parkgate RecCentre.
- 5. Municipal Social Planning and North Van RecCommission staff work with North Vancouver School Board No. 44 to assist schools in becoming eligible and in applying for Provincial dollars available when schools operate as 'community centres/schools'.
- 6. Specific Joint Use Agreements be prepared for:
 - a. Rates, Subsidies and Booking Systems;
 - b. Facility Programming.
