Mayor Loucks presented the following Budget Address:

Tonight the City is bringing forward its 1997 Annual Budget and tax rates. This budget is required by the Municipal Act to be ratified by May 15, 1997 in order for the municipality to be in a legal position to operate.

The budget process this year has been a particularly difficult one for most municipalities in British Columbia, as we all have had to do our best to deal with significant funding cuts by the Province. In the City of North Vancouver, these cuts amounted to almost \$930,000. equivalent to a 4.5% increase in taxation. In addition, the tax assessment value of the grain terminals located in the City was significantly lowered, and taxation of both utilities and BC Rail properties was restricted by new Provincial legislation. These additional changes cause a further loss equivalent to a 2.5% tax increase, so that the City was initially faced with almost 7% in tax losses based on Provincial government actions.

Keeping these factors in mind, Council has met with staff and representatives of Boards, Commissions and other organizations who receive City funding, as well as the City's own departments, to discuss and examine their budgetary requests and review operations. This process has occurred over a six month period and Council has carefully considered all budgetary requests. Given the reduction in Provincial funding, it has not been possible to entertain many new funding initiatives, rather, the focus has been on obtaining operational efficiencies wherever possible. Throughout this process, Council have focused on opportunities to re-allocate the available funds to areas of greatest need.

The final result for 1997 has been an approved increase of 3.4% in municipal taxes, a reduction of 3.6% from the 7% we were faced with at the start of the year. As well, the 3.4% tax increase includes a 1.5% levy that is being set aside to fund capital maintenance of the City's infrastructure. Council's support for this levy reflects our determination not to allow Provincial cutbacks to result in neglect of the recreation centres, roads, parks and other facilities for which the City is responsible. The remaining 1.9% will fund a number of urgently needed items, including a new Lower Lonsdale Neighbourhood Constable, continued support for Adult Crossing Guards in the City, and additional funding for the Recreation Commission's voucher program for those in need.

The 3.4% increase is being levied equally to all property classes as this was felt by Council to be the most equitable way to distribute the impact of the Provincial cuts. For the residential class, this means that the municipal levy for an average single family home owner will increase by about \$39. while the average municipal levy for a condominium owner will increase by about \$10. due to their lower property assessment.

The City Council continues to take pride in ensuring that the City's tax levy remains amongst the lowest in the Lower Mainland without compromising services offered to our taxpayers.

Increased emphasis continues to be placed on the City's livability. Some of the exciting initiatives that have been undertaken in 1996 or that are planned for 1997 include:

- Construction of a new building to house the RCMP and the North and West Vancouver Emergency Services has been completed, on schedule and within budget. Staff moved into the building in March of this year and a grand opening ceremony for the community is scheduled for July of this year with the RCMP Musical Ride.
- Along with this new building, a new civic plaza and renovations to East 14th Street are in place or under construction to enhance the City's central business district.
- Construction of a Lower Level Route to accommodate East/West traffic between Esplanade and 1st Street commenced in 1996, and will be completed in 1997.
 The City will fund this largely through the Infrastructure Improvement Program co-sponsored by the Federal and Provincial Governments.
- To date, Council set aside a total of \$405,000. for the renovation of the Centennial Theatre, to provide greater accessibility, lobby space, and backstage renovations. An infrastructure grant to enhance these renovations will be applied for under the new "Cultural Grants" program.

- A 9,000 sq. foot addition to the City Hall to provide new meeting space and
 offices for City staff currently housed offsite, has been authorized by Council. In
 addition, the existing City Hall interior will be renovated to upgrade the air
 conditioning system, increase accessibility in the Council Chamber, and meet
 WCB requirements for an enhanced first aid facility. It is important to
 emphasize that this minor addition is fully funded from monies set aside for this
 purpose prior to 1997, the cost of this renovation therefore has no impact on the
 1997 tax levy.
- In addition, Council have continued their support for social policy initiatives in the City. In 1997, the City will complete a City Social Plan, to be integrated into the City's Official Community Plan, produce a Cultural Diversity Policy, and fund a Task Force on the issue of Affordable Housing.
- An Environmental Protection Program Committee of public and staff has been appointed by Council, and will be bringing forward recommendations for a Citywide Environmental Protection Program.

Substantial progress is also being made towards development of the Lower Lonsdale area with the associated improvements in residential and business opportunities. One of the City's properties has been marketed and more sales are planned with careful consideration of the needs of both new and existing residents of the area. A Lower Lonsdale Planning Office is operating in the Chamber of Commerce building to better address issues related to the area while property is being marketed. All members of the public are invited to visit the office and provide staff with comments or concerns, and to participate in the public consultation process for Lower Lonsdale which is now underway.

The City's Planning staff are working closely with the owners of the old Versatile Shipyards site, and with the new owners of the undeveloped lands in the southwest corner of the City, to expedite redevelopment of these large areas that will play a major role in the future ambiance of the City's waterfront area. A major focus of Council's deliberations is to ensure that City residents obtain increased waterfront access and recreational opportunities and amenities.

It is encouraging to see wonderful examples of community involvement in our City, and I would like to commend the many members of our community who work on various Council committees, task forces, and community events to ensure that community involvement remains strong. Although we live in one of the largest urban areas in Canada, City residents are demonstrating empathy and interest in their community. It is that interest that makes North Vancouver City a great place in which to live and work.
