Mr. Harold Holmes reviewed the "Final Report on Noise Complaint by City of North Vancouver" prepared by the Rail Infrastructure Directorate, Rail and Marine Branch, Canadian Transportation Agency, August, 1997. Mr. Holmes. advised members of Council that the Noise Control Committee will continue to monitor and evaluate the mitigation measures as identified in the said Final Report. The Committee will also be examining the issue of train whistles at the Chesterfield Crossing as well as carrying out its mandate to work with the waterfront industries to mitigate noise emanating from their industrial plants.

Mr. Holmes indicated there was good cooperation from other businesses, but there was little if any, cooperation from CN Rail. Mr. Shorter confirmed there had been no changes for some time.
