4. (b) Noise Bylaw Exemption – File: 4020-03

Report: North Shore Health Region, November 12, 1998

PURSUANT to the report of the North Shore Health Region entitled "Noise Bylaw Exemption Request – Kedco Constructors Ltd., 801 West 1st Street", and dated November 12, 1998:

THAT Kedco Constructors' request for an exemption from Section 6, Schedule "B" of the Noise Bylaw, be granted on the following conditions:

1. The hours of construction work is extended, but limited to:

Weekdays: Between 0700 hours and 2300 hours Saturdays: Between 1000 hours and 2000 hours Sundays: Between 1000 hours and 1700 hours

- 2. The extended hours do not apply to the work involving the transportation of the soil from the storage facility at 60 Fell Avenue to the off-site disposal location. Such work shall be carried out during the permitted hours stipulated in the Noise Bylaw for construction work.
- 3. Kedco Constructors Ltd., shall notify residents of the Mission Indian Reserve in writing of the work being carried out.
- 4. The exemption be valid from the date approved by the Mayor and expires December 7, 1998.
- 5. During this period, should there be noise complaints regarding the work being done during the extended hours, Council may revoke the exemption if it is in the best interest of the public.
