WHEREAS the National Research Council of Canada (NRC), in response to the needs of municipal stakeholders, has proposed the development of a national technical guide for municipal infrastructure (Guide) to be based on proven best practices in infrastructure long-term planning, assets management, costs control, maintenance and repair;

**WHEREAS** it is estimated that the use of the Guide could save in excess of \$1 billion annually to Canadian municipalities (\$600,000 for a municipality of 20,000 people);

**WHEREAS** the Government of Canada has committed \$10 million and the Province of Quebec has committed \$1 million to the proposed \$20 million (\$15 million cash, \$5 million in kind) five-year project;

**WHEREAS** infrastructure stakeholders, public and private, will contribute \$5 million in in-kind services to the development of the Guide;

**WHEREAS** input into the national guide will be regionally based, thereby giving provincial and territorial interests a greater role and responsibility in its development; and

**WHEREAS** the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, of which the City of North Vancouver is an active member, strongly supports the technical guide project;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of North Vancouver supports the development of the National Technical Guide for Municipal Infrastructure;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the City of North Vancouver requests the Union of British Columbia Municipalities to support the National Technical Guide for Municipal Infrastructure;
