**WHEREAS** the potential impacts upon the City of North Vancouver of this proposed third crossing have not been articulated;

**AND WHEREAS** the proponents of this proposed third crossing have made no effort to solicit responses from the government or the citizens of the City of North Vancouver to this proposal;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** North Vancouver City Council oppose the construction of any third crossing of Burrard Inlet with a terminus in or near the City of North Vancouver;
