THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the IWA demand the government immediately reinstate the BC Rail passenger service between North Vancouver and Prince George;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the national convention of IWA Canada express its unequivocal opposition to the lease, sale or closure of any portion of BC Rail;

AND BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED THAT the IWA work with communities and other concerned groups and citizens of the Province to mount a campaign to ensure that the valuable passenger and freight services of BC Rail are maintained for the benefit of all communities and the people of the Province of British Columbia."
