Mr. J. Brent Sawchyn, COO, Principal, Anterra Retail Properties Ltd., presented his latest conceptual drawings for a revised development at 879 Marine Drive.

He advised that the project has been reduced in size to 89,000 sq. ft., from 233,000 sq. ft., and this equates to an FSR of 0.48 reduced from 1.3. He further advised that the inclusion of a 46,000 sq. ft. food store is still being contemplated on the site along with other tenants under 6,000 sq. ft., except for a drug store tenant of 15,000 sq. ft.

**AND THAT** the property owner be ordered to cease and desist any vehicle repair or dismantling, other than necessary vehicle repairs on a vehicle used exclusively for his personal transportation, and to remove any other items, which are contributing to the untidy and unsightly state at the property, by April 21, 2003;

**AND THAT** should the property remain untidy and unsightly, or vehicle repairs or dismantling continue in contravention of City Bylaws, that staff be authorized to seek the appropriate relief, including an injunction by way of the Supreme Court of British Columbia, thus requiring the property to be brought into compliance with City bylaws.
