 - 2. A base residential density of 1.6 FSR to be attributed to the North Vancouver School District Administration Building/Artist for Kids Trust Building with any additional density realized on-site to be attributed to the upgrade of Ridgeway School as a first priority;
 - 3. That staff prepare a terms of reference to be secured by covenant for further revenues generated by the North Vancouver School District through subsequent density transfers with funds to be directed to "North Vancouver School District-City Community Amenities". "North Vancouver School District City Community Amenities" are to include North Vancouver School District capital projects in the City not normally funded by the Province of British Columbia and including the upgrade of Ridgeway School as the highest priority;
 - At the Queen Mary site, attempt to accommodate transferable density on Parcels 2A and 2B in excess of 1.6 FSR but within a four storey building;
 - At the Lonsdale site, attempt to accommodate transferable density on Parcel 2 in excess of 1.6 FSR at up to 6 storeys on the easterly portion of the site;
