Re: 654 West 15th Street (Smart House) – File: 3360-01 2011

Mr. Mehrdad Rahbar, Vernacular Design Inc., Owner's Agent, made a presentation regarding "654 West 15th Street (Smart House)", as follows:

- Features and Objectives:
 - retention of existing house built 1950's;
 - construction of an infill unit in the rear 1,250 sq. ft.;
 - partially finished interiors components;
 - lower the initial purchase price by 12-15%;
 - solar energy roughing-in for both units;
 - legal secondary suite in the main house (900 sq. ft.).
- Mechanisms:
 - covenant registered on title.
- Challenges:
 - development permit;
 - building permit;
 - municipal fees;
 - legal fees;
 - conventional financing (borrowing at 12%).
- Infill successfully complete.
- Main House:
 - marketed at \$800,000 (partially complete), \$89,000 (more to complete).

Ms. Annette Castell, Resident, City of North Vancouver, gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding "Off-Leash Use at Kings Mill Walk", as follows:

- would like entire park be made an off leash dog park;
- suggests an off leash park with no fences;
- have cyclists dismount within the park area;
- saves on building fences and paving a new parallel path;
- a second option would be to divide users with a fence;
- only the second public park to have dogs off leash;
- it is the only park that is flat for seniors to come to with pets and seating;
- 346 names on petition supporting this idea;
- requested that the off leash area include Green Park south of Spa Utopia fenced or not fenced.

AND THAT staff report back with proposed amendments to "Schedule F – Dogs in Parks" of the "Parks Regulation Bylaw, 1996, No. 6611."

Ms. Pam Chilton, Resident, City of North Vancouver, gave a presentation regarding "384 East Keith Road, North Vancouver", as follows:

- completing the project of rebuilding their house;
- were told during construction not to worry about damaging their sidewalk as it will be a part of the Green Necklace project;
- quoted \$1,800 from the City of North Vancouver to fix the sidewalk and curbing in front of 384 East Keith Road;
- the City agreed to reduce the cost to \$1,000;
- they have gone over budget with their house construction;
- based on financial considerations would like to ask Council to forego the \$1,000 cost;
- circulated a picture of the City's backhoe on their sidewalk suggesting that it caused some of the damage.
