- Creating a vibrant, exciting, active location that would benefit the merchants, students and the City;
- Student enrollment has become diversified and the needs of students are changing;
- Services people from age 2 to 92 through their Continuing Education Programs;
- Just opened the BOSA Centre for Film and Animation:
- Working on a Campus Master Plan implementation and thinking that suggests the possibility of building residency buildings for students;
- Enhancing a number of initiatives in particular Enrollment Management Services, Marketing and Communications and expanding Continuing Education Programs to focus more on training, leadership and career enhancement;

- Believes they will need to partner in order to achieve their potential goals;
- Integrated the Down Town Campus for UBC;
- No capital investment are in these projects;

- Short intensive career building programs are well placed in easily accessible locations;
- Partnerships with businesses, managerial development needs can be established when it is easy for people to go after work and lunchtimes;
- Both participants and business benefit.
