Re: "Stop the Violence BC, Does Marijuana Prohibition Make Our Communities Less Safe?" – File: 0320-01

Delegation requested by Council on April 2, 2012.

Dr. Evan Wood, Professor of Medicine, University of British Columbia, Director, Urban Health Initiative, BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS, gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding "Stop the Violence BC, Does Marijuana Prohibition Make Our Communities Less Safe?", as follows:

- evidence of organized crime and gang violence linked to marijuana industry;
- 2004 statistic, cannabis trade estimated to have generated \$7 billion dollars annually for organized crime;
- statistics on costs of war on drugs in the U.S.;
- U.S. government data shows that as marijuana supply has been reduced over the years, potency has increased exponentially;
- patterns of cannabis availability;
- National Institute on Drug Abuse auditing of drug problem;
- unintended consequences, parallels with prohibition;
- International Journal of Drug Policy Effect of Drug Law Enforcement on Drug Market Violence: A systematic review;
- Angus Reid Poll indicates two-thirds in BC would legalize marijuana to reduce violence;
- Stop the Violence BC membership;
- major publication education effort focusing on:
 - failure of supply reduction
 - harms of existing model
 - value of a regulated market
- regulation of cannabis in BC: harms of prohibition, legalization and regulation of cannabis;
- Angus Reid data statements about marijuana;
- looking for support from City of North Vancouver to help drive this discussion.

Re: Stop the Violence BC Campaign: File: 0320-01

WHEREAS cannabis prohibition efforts have failed to effectively limit the availability of cannabis, especially to our youth;

WHEREAS cannabis prohibition has created a large financial opportunity that has fueled an increasingly violent illegal market with expanding organized crime involvement;

WHEREAS academic, law enforcement and health experts, including the Health Officers Council of BC believe that a strictly controlled public health oriented regulatory framework for cannabis control has the potential to reduce rates of cannabis use, raise substantial tax revenue, undermine organized crime and save law enforcement time and expenditures;

WHEREAS many BC municipalities are increasingly affected by the harms of cannabis prohibition (e.g. grow-ops, etc.), which negatively impacts community health and safety;

WHEREAS BC municipalities are increasingly bearing the financial burden of failed policy approaches that emphasize enforcement of marijuana prohibition over evidence-based policies, consuming significant portions of municipal budgets and diverting law enforcement attention away from criminal activities where police involvement can better improve community safety;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of North Vancouver supports the taxation and regulation of cannabis to address the ineffectiveness and harms of cannabis prohibition, and write to the Lower Mainland Local Government Association, Union of BC Municipalities, Federation of Canadian Municipalities, and Provincial and Federal Ministers in the Justice and Health departments to inform them of our support;

AND THAT a copy of this resolution be submitted to the Union of BC Municipalities as an emergency resolution for the 2012 Union of BC Municipalities Convention;
